**Hook:**



**Copy Cat (Game).** What does it mean to imitate the behavior of someone else? It means to do what they do, or “copy cat” them. It is crucial for us, if we claim to be Christians, that we “copy cat” Christ. Spend some time playing “copy cat,” performing difficult tasks that the students may have a hard time doing. Repeat them if necessary. What kinds of things would Jesus do that He would want us to copy?




**Temptations of the World (Worksheet/Discussion).** Color the picture of the world with the worldly attitudes written on it. Why are these things so difficult for us to resist? What can happen if we give in to the ways of the world? Talk about how we as Christians must separate ourselves from those things. Is it possible for people who say they are Christians to love the things of the world as much as they love God? Can we have both? Save this picture for later use during the TOOK time, **1JN02.GF1.**





**This Is a Test (Quiz).** Take the true/false quiz, **1JN02.GF2**, and discuss the results. How did you know the true answers were true? The answers were things that you had more than likely experienced, therefore you knew that they were true. How do we know if what people say about Jesus is true or not? We must read and study the Word of God to know for sure what is true and what is false. The apostle John was with Jesus and experienced His teaching and miracles. He was actually there! We can study the words he has written and know that God inspired all that he tells us. Today we will hear more about how we can tell if people are true believers or not.




**What Is the Truth about Who Christ Is? (Review Worksheet).** Have students use a dark crayon to color in the boxes that are false and a yellow crayon to color in the boxes that are true, **1JN02.GF3.**

 **Counterfeit or Real? (*Demonstration*).** Using the newer paper currency, discuss with the children how they can tell a true U.S. bill from a counterfeit bill. How can you tell? What are some things to look for, some tests to check? Look for the water mark, use a test pen, etc. In our Bible Adventure today, we'll hear about some tests of true Christianity.

 **Copy Cats (*Discussion*).** Using a popular child's collectible (i.e., sports cards, Beanie Babies) discuss with the children how they can tell whether or not these are the true collectibles or copy cats. This may be a good opportunity to talk about envy or boasting also as many of the children may talk about which collectibles they have or want and what their value is.

 **Light in the Darkness (*Memory Verse Review*).** Use fluorescent paint and 3x5 index cards to spell out last week's Bible verse. Paint one letter on each card and number the back of the cards in order. Place the letters around the room. With the lights off, have the children look for the letters using their flashlights. When all of the letters are found, use the numbers on the back of the cards to put them in order. Review the verse and what it means with the children.

 **In Real Life, Who do You Love? (*Role Play*).** Here are four situations you could act out or have older students act out. Have the other students talk about what was wrong with the way one of the characters was acting.

Scenario #1: (Hating your brother) An older sister has a one year old baby sister. Whenever anyone visits, the baby gets all the attention, and the older sister gets left out. The older sister complains out loud to herself about how she hates her sister and wishes she would not have been born.

Scenario #2: (Lust of the eye) A boy is reading a Christmas catalogue and sees several things he wants. He cuts out the pictures and puts them on his mirror and constantly talks about them to his parents.

Scenario #3 (Lust of the Flesh) A girl watches hours of TV and won't do any other activity when asked.

Scenario #4 (Boastful pride of life) In a conversation among three people, one boy always has done something (fishing, skiing, running, grades, etc.) better, more, or longer than the other two.

### **Book:**

#### ***Bible Adventure –***

Have you ever been the victim of somebody else's lie? Falling for a lie always costs us--whether in wounded feelings or something more serious. The world would be an easier place to live if everyone were honest, wouldn't it? Sadly, people who lie are everywhere in this world. It was the same in Bible times, too, when the apostle John was writing letters to churches made up of brand-new believers in Jesus Christ. Men who claimed to be believers, were spreading lies within the new church. John heard of it and hurried to write to the new babes in Christ, whom he called "my little children." He did not want them to fall for the lies being told. He knew there was much more at stake than just hurt feelings or a loss of trust. If believed, these lies would have an eternal cost.

What were the lies? The false teachers said that matter, which makes up the physical world, was evil. Therefore, they reasoned, Christ could not have been both fully God and fully man. In chapter one of 1 John, the apostle reminds the believers that he was an eyewitness to the fact that Jesus was both, without a doubt. The false teachers also spread the lie that sin was not important, and even that it did not exist! These were dangerous, dangerous teachings. What is the natural conclusion to make if we swallow the lie that we don't have a problem with sin? If we have no sin, we don't need a Savior, do we? But John wrote, and the rest of God's Word plainly teaches, that every person ever living (with the exception of Jesus Christ) has a problem with sin--a problem that will destroy us without God's rescue.

How were these new believers to protect themselves from the lies being spread? The best defense against a lie has always been, and always will be, the truth. John wrote to give them some tests they could use to test both the quality and the teaching of anyone claiming to speak God's truth.

As we read chapter two of 1 John, the apostle continues to share about the kind of life a genuine Christian would lead. The person who really knows God will do what God says. This is the way John wrote it: "We know that we have come to know Him if we obey His commands." (2:3) Only God's Spirit can give us the power to obey Him week after week, year after year. Someone who is only pretending to be saved or who is deceived about their salvation cannot do that. Sooner or later they will fail, big time. John wanted those who were reading his letter to be able to clearly tell a true Christian from a pretend Christian. Obedience to God's word, John said, was a solid way to test. Anyone who claimed to know God but was not obedient to God's Word was a liar. The false teachers showed by the way they lived their lives that they were not at all interested in following God's ways. God's children, as they obey His Word, will live more and more the way Jesus did, and will more and more have the same qualities God has (2:6).

The most important quality a true Christian should have is love for others. John wanted the new believers to ask themselves, "Do these false teachers love others the way Christ did?" They bragged about knowing more about God than anyone else, but they showed no love toward the others in the church. John said: "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness." (2:9) In other words, they are not a true follower of Christ. That we love others is of the greatest importance to God. Jesus said to His disciples, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34). That is the proof that we are God's child, that we have love for other believers.

Not only did the false teachers reveal a lack of love for others, but their lives showed that it was not God they loved, but the world. There is no middle ground here. We can't have it both ways--we will either love God, or we will love what the world has to offer. The false teachers were caught up in the ideas of man, ones that made them feel good about themselves but were from Satan himself.

Another important quality a true Christian should have is a love for the truth. What we believe is vitally important to God. What we believe about Christ will tell everything about our spiritual condition. John couldn't have used stronger words--"Who is the liar? It is the man who denies that Jesus is the Christ" (2:22). John labeled this kind of person an "antichrist" because their false teachings twisted the truth and went against the heart of God's Word. Truth is the best test of whether a person is a real believer or a make-believer because God has given every believer the Holy Spirit to live within them and help them tell truth from lies. The unbeliever, since he does not have the Holy Spirit, can't know the truth at all. The false teachers claimed to be the only ones who knew the truth. They claimed to be the only ones who could teach this "truth" to others. John told the new Christians that because they had the Holy Spirit, they had the ability to understand everything God wanted them to know. They didn't need any "special teachers" with "special knowledge."

The Bible tell us that we are to examine, or test ourselves to see if we are really in the faith (belonging to Christ) (1 Cor. 13:5). We've heard about two ways to test. First, love for others. How does your life stack up? Do you have a Christ-like love for those around you as you remember God's love for you? Do you show caring in attitudes of patience, generosity with what you have, kindness and unselfishness to others? Have you discovered enough of God's truth that you realize the foolishness of chasing after what the world has to offer, and found your satisfaction and your heart's desire in God?

Second, we can test to see if we are in the faith by what we believe about God and God's Word. Are you convinced that all of the truth you will ever need can be found in the Bible? If not, what steps will you take to get to that point? If your view of God is not anchored in Scripture, if it's wrong or even slightly off, it will make a big difference in your relationship with Him. Jesus said, "The truth will set you free" (John 8:32). The truth includes all of who God is, all of who Jesus is, and all of the teachings passed on to us in God's Word. A true believer knows the truth, receives freedom from sin, and is free to enjoy the closeness of an deep relationship with the mighty God of the universe.

## Look:



**The Love Connection (Craft).** Read 1John 2:3-6. Our love and obedience to Christ connects us to the Father as well as to other believers. This connection allows us to fellowship with each other as well as with God Himself. WOW! How are we able to fellowship directly with the One and only holy God of the universe? Now read 1John 2:1-2 and answer that question. Christ paid the price that allows us to be able to come into the presence of God. To complete this simple craft, cut a piece of red construction paper in half lengthwise and fold it into thirds, accordion-style. Now cut out a heart shape, being careful to leave the folded edges intact. Don't cut on the folds so that when you open it up the hearts will be connected. Write "Love and Obedience to Christ" in the center heart, "God" on the heart to the left, and "Other Believers" on the heart to the right. Copy the verse, 1John 2:5, on the back of the hearts and stand it on the desktop.



**Walking Like Christ (Activity).** Make a multitude of footprint shapes and write phrases on them that the children can read and understand. Write examples of what Christ would do and other examples of unChrist-like behavior. Scatter these throughout the classroom. Be sure to have plenty so that they have to stop, read, and think before they decide what to do with that footprint. Instruct them to move around the room and look at all the footprints. They only want to pick up those that say something they think Jesus would do. Leave the others in place. Once the students are finished, ask them to bring the ones they collected to the front of the class. Paste these on the board in the front of the class and use them to discuss what it means to walk like Christ. If we claim to be Christian we should be walking like Christ.



**Looking at the Evidence (Activity).** Pretending to be detectives, use magnifying glasses, disguises, or other props to make it interesting. Ask the question, "How can you tell if someone is a real Christian or a false believer?" What kinds of things would be evident in their lives? Have the students write their ideas on **1JN02.GF4**. Use Galatians 5:16-26, Matthew 20:26-28, Galatians 1:10, Ephesians 4:1-2, Ephesians 4:29, Ephesians 5:1-17, and 2 Corinthians 13:5 to help you in your discussion. Are these present in our lives?



**Are We Reflecting God's Character? (Craft).** Cut out a mirror-shaped piece of construction paper or card stock. Paste a piece of reflective foil to the front and write 1John 2:5-6 on the back. Talk about the fact that if we are truly Christians others will be able to see the reflection of God's character in us. What an awesome privilege it is to reflect God upon others! How successful are we at doing this?



**Passage Review Questions (Worksheet).** This booklet contains many questions from the Scripture passage covered in today's lesson. Students may work on them in class and complete them during the week at home, **1JN02.GF5**.



**Knowing God (Memory Verse Exercise).** Have students find the secret message by first finding the names of the colors in the puzzle and crossing them out. Next, have them start at the top left box and read right to left. Put the letters in the spaces provided to find the secret message, **1JN02.GF6 Pg. 1**, answers are found on **1JN02.GF6 Pg. 2**.

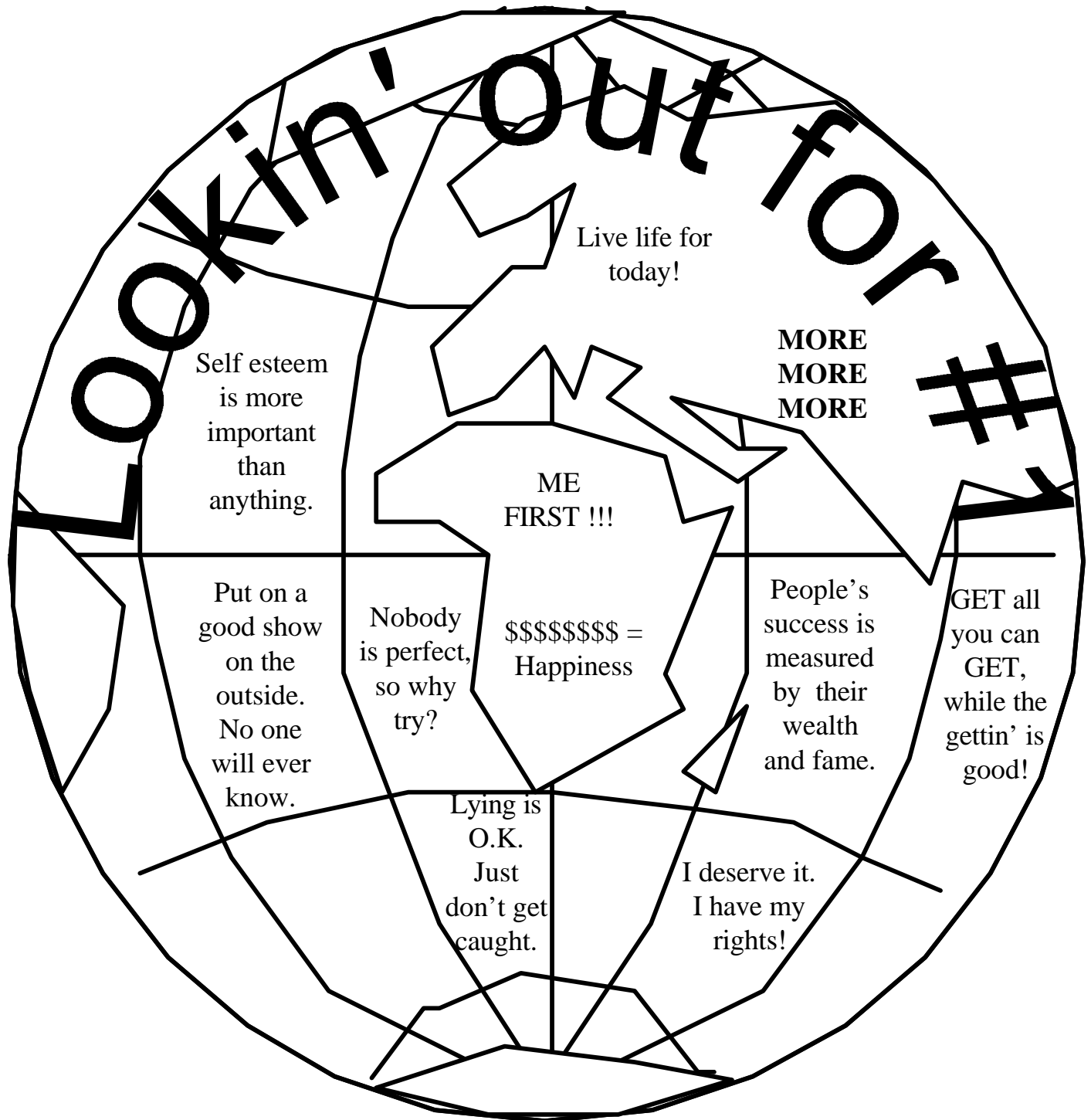


**How Do People Know You Are a Christian? (Discussion).**  If someone examined your life carefully, is there evidence of fellowship with Christ? Are you living in the light or in the darkness?

How do you know? What are three things people would say about you if they knew you would never find out what they said? Can you think of three examples of fruit in your life? What “sets you apart” from others living in the world? Give three ideas.

- Obedience Graph (*Take Home Activity*)**. Use the graph on **1JN02.GF8** and stickers to chart the evidence of Christ in your life this coming week. As you reflect Christ to others or portray unChrist-like behavior, follow your actions throughout the week. Use the stickers, both written and blank, to fill in words that correspond with your actions. See the example at the display board at the Children’s Ministry table. Encourage the students to bring them back next week. Following Christ’s example is not always easy. That’s why our graphs will go up and down naturally throughout the week. After all He was God and we’re not!
- Loving Others (*Craft/Take Home Assignment*)**. Encourage the students to color **1JN02.GF9 Pg.1** and **2**, cut them out and paste them onto construction paper. Have each student take it home to reference this week. Tell them to hang it where they’ll see it or carry it with them. Use this as a reminder that how we love others is reflective of how we love Christ. Read 1John 2:9-11 and discuss ways we might harbor animosity toward someone else, even if we don’t directly come out and say we hate them. Keep this card close by and encourage the students to jot down times throughout the week where they shared the love of Christ with someone else. This could be anywhere from sharing their lunch at school, to helping a neighbor, to being kind to a sibling. You could ask them to bring these back next week to see how they did.
- Don’t Be Distracted By the World (*Game*)**. Use this as a time-filler if needed, or develop this idea further if you want, and make it into an actual activity. Incorporate the HOOK activity completed earlier, “Temptation of the World” if appropriate. Ask the students to proceed along a taped line on the floor or a balance beam raised above the floor. As they walk along (you could reuse the footprints from the “Walking Like Christ” activity completed earlier during the LOOK time), the teachers are gently hitting them with pillows and trying to knock them off track. As they walk along, they could be reciting the memory verse, and the teachers are calling out temptations or distractions which occur in the world that might cause us to stumble, get side-tracked, or lose sight of where we are headed. There should be a consequence for falling off of the line (such as going back to the starting point), as well as a reward for those who finally make it to the end of the path. Start the game by reading 1John 2:15-17.
- Walk in the Light (*Craft*)**. Have students make mirror or window stickers. Each student will need:  
(1) piece of 3 x 6 3/4’ transparent book cover material  
Permanent or dry erase markers  
Have them use permanent or dry erase markers to make 'stained glass' or draw pictures of things that remind them of walking in the light and obedience (i.e., sun, footprints, smiling face ). Using a black permanent marker, they should write, "WALK IN THE LIGHT 1 Jn.2:3" or write out the entire verse. Ask the children to put these on a mirror or window that they use or see daily and challenge them to reflect upon whether or not they are walking in obedience.
- Memory Verse Chart (*Learning Incentive*)**. Here is a chart for you to use to help keep track of the verses your kids have said for 1 John, **1JN02.GF10**.
- Walking in the Light Flashlight Test (*Memory Verse Incentive*)** Have students say the memory verse for last week and assign the verse for next week. When they memorize all the verses they will earn a neon flashlight.
