We Walk in Jesus' Light by Obeying.

Materials I Need:

Theme for the book of 1 John: Little children can walk in Jesus' light.

Memory Verse for the book of 1 John:

Two- and three-year-old verse: If we walk in the light...we have fellowship with one another.
1 John 1:7

Four- and five-year-old verse: If we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another. 1 John 1:7

Attribute of God emphasized in 1 John 2: God is holy and has no fellowship with sin.

Aim Questions for 2's & 3's:

1. **Did John write the letter called 1 John?** *(Yes. The Apostle John wrote 1 John.)*
2. **Did John say that God is light?** *(Yes. Say, "God is light and in Him there is no darkness.")*
3. **Do we have fellowship with God and with other Christians when we walk in Jesus' light?** *(Yes.)*
4. **Do we walk in Jesus' light when we obey our parents and love the people in our families and at church?** *(Yes. Sing one or more verses of the theme song, "Walking in the Light." See the Song section.)*

Aim Questions for 4's, 5's & K:

1. **Who wrote the letter called 1 John?** *(The Apostle John wrote 1 John.)*
2. **What did John say about light and darkness?** *("God is light, and in Him there is no darkness at all.")*
3. **How do we have fellowship with God and with other Christians?** *(We tell God and the other person that we are sorry for the wrong thing we did. We obey God and our parents to walk in Jesus' light.)*
4. **Are we walking in Jesus' light or in the darkness when we hate someone? (Darkness) When we obey our parents? (Light) When we envy what someone else has or brag about what we have? (Darkness)**
5. **Sing verses three and four of the theme song, "Walking in the Light."** *(See the Song section.)*

Key for symbols:

- This box symbol represents ideas that can be used for two-year-olds through kindergarten. Please remember to slow down the pace for two-year-olds and keep the pace moving for five-year-olds.
- ② This symbol represents ideas that are best used for two- and three-year-olds.
- ④ This symbol represents ideas that are best used for four-year-olds through kindergarten.

Hook:

- Home Center:** Set up a living center with dishes, clothes, and other available materials to represent a home living situation. One of the classroom leaders could represent the parent and work with the children to clean, rearrange, share and work together. Talk about helping each other with a good attitude when asked to do something. John wrote to the early Christians to say that walking in Jesus'

light means obeying parents with a good attitude. Jesus gave a good example because He always obeyed His heavenly Father.

- Role Playing with Puppets:** Provide several different puppets from which the small group leader chooses two to talk to each other while the children watch. The first play scenario would include one puppet bragging to the other. Discuss what bragging is between the two puppets (who you are and what you have is better than someone else's) and then ask the children what they think bragging is and what the puppet who was caught bragging should do. A second play scenario would include two puppets, one disliking the other because he has a new toy. This is called envy (a feeling of unhappiness thinking about the other with the toy). After a short discussion between the two puppets, ask the children what should happen when one puppet wants what belongs to another. A third conversation would include a child puppet disobeying the parent puppet. After a short role play, ask the group what the child puppet could do to obey his parent. In today's Bible Adventure, Apostle John writes that when people brag, envy, or disobey, then they are not in fellowship or friendship with God and are not walking in His light.
- Bubble Cellophane Packing Center:** Bring as much bubble wrapping material as possible to class. Have the children pop the bubbles with their fingers, hands, elbows, seats, or feet. "In today's Bible Adventure, John tells the Christians to not stay mad or angry at anyone. One way to use our feet or hands when we are angry would be to pop these bubbles. It uses energy and it doesn't make anyone feel sad."
- Right and Wrong Review: (1JN01ECGF5 or 1JN01ECGF6)** To remind the children of things that are right and wrong, give each child a 1JN01ECGF5 or 1JN01ECGF6 page taken from the first lesson of 1 John. Each square holds something good or something bad. The children will be given fruit loops (Cheerios, M&M's) to put on the good things. Talk about how Jesus wants us to always do the right thing, and if we fail, we should ask Him to forgive us by saying we are sorry. Ask the children what they will say to Jesus if they do wrong. When they answer by saying they are sorry, they can keep the fruit loops on their pages or string them onto a long piece of yarn to make a necklace.
- Bean Bag Game: (1JN01ECGF5 or 1JN01ECGF6)** Place enlarged GF5 and GF6 pictures of children doing kind, good, and right things on the floor along with mean, wrong pictures. If a child's bag lands on a good picture, he gets another turn.
- Jesus Washes My Sin Away: (1JN02ECGF11)** Let the children color the GF11 pictures. The top picture is of a dirty child standing at the side of the bath tub. The tub is clean. Have the children paste clean fluffy cotton balls to make the bubbles in the tub. The bottom picture shows that the tub is dirty but the child standing next to the tub is squeaky clean. Have the children paste coffee-stained cotton balls to the tub picture. Tell the children how Jesus cleanses us of our sins in our hearts when we go to Him and ask Him to forgive us. Telling God we are sorry and not wanting to sin anymore shows Him we want to be clean children.
- Last Week's Review Activity:** Look over last week's activities, repeat one the children enjoyed, or try a different one you haven't already done.
- ④ **Rhyming Game:** Explain that rhyming words sound alike. Give the following examples: boat and coat, dog and log. The leader will then read the following lines one at a time and wait for a response from the children. "I'm thinking of a word that rhymes with mouse and it is where I live." (House)
Look, and the Bible is one that I read. (Book)
Ham, and I eat it on toast. (Jam)
Hike, and it has two wheels and I ride on it. (Bike)
The Apostle John, and it's what I do when I'm tired. (Yawn)
Okay, and when I do something I've been asked to do I. . . (Obey)
Wood, and when I am not bad, I am. . . (Good)
Brother, and it is one of my parents. (Mother)
Mad, and it is when I am unhappy. (Sad)
Fall, and it is very high. (Tall)
Chin, and when I disobey God, it is called. . . (Sin)
Right, and it's where I walk in fellowship with Jesus. (Light)


Some of the words in the rhyming game will be heard again in the Bible Adventure. Careful listeners will hear them.

- ④ **Play Dough:** Use yellow play dough and wrap it around dark rocks. Talk about the dark rock representing us with our sin in darkness. The yellow represents Jesus and when we say we are sorry, He fills us with His light and we aren't filled with dirty sin anymore. The Bible Adventure will tell us more about walking in Jesus' light.



Book:

Presentation Ideas -

-  Color and mount the **1JN02ECGF1, 1JN02ECGF2, 1JN02ECGF3, 1JN02ECGF4, 1JN02ECGF5,** and **1JN02ECGF6** pictures on construction paper. Show them as you tell the Bible Adventure. Save the pictures and use them for review as you continue through the book of 1 John.

Bible Adventure for 2's & 3's-

(Show last week's 1JN01ECGF3 picture.) God the Son, Jesus, came to earth to shine His light to us. Jesus never did one thing that was wrong while He was on earth. Jesus always obeyed His heavenly Father.

If you and I believe that Jesus is the light from heaven, and look to Him as the people in this picture are doing, we will walk in His light and will have fellowship with God and with Jesus. We can talk to God and we won't fall into selfish sin.

(Point to the dark side of the page.) These people are falling down because they are not walking in the light. *(Point to the light side of the page.)* We want to walk in Jesus' light by obeying our parents.

John said in the book of 1 John, "If you are walking in Jesus' light, you will not hate your brother or sister." It is easy to get mad at our brothers and sisters, but we must quickly forgive them so that we can have fellowship with God and with them.

Here are three pictures that show people with anger and hate in their hearts.

(Show the GF2 picture.) In this picture, the brother has hit his sister. The sister is sad and angry at her brother. If she stays angry and hates her brother, she will not be walking in Jesus' light. The apostle John wrote, "If you are walking in Jesus' light, you will forgive your brother and not stay mad because Jesus forgives you."

(Show the GF3 picture. Pretend to put your thumbs in your suspenders and swagger around.) The Apostle John wrote, "Don't brag about what you have and what you can do. Don't say *(in sing-song fashion)*, 'Ha, ha, ha, ha, ha! I have more than you have!' That's bragging and bragging is a sin."

(Show the GF4 picture.) When you want what someone else has, you might start hating them in your heart. Tell God you are sorry when you are envious of another person for having something you want.

(Show the GF5 picture.) Disobeying your parents is always wrong. Jesus always obeyed His heavenly Father when He was on earth. Jesus always had fellowship and enjoyed talking with His Father, day and night. Even if you don't like what your mom and dad have asked you to do, if you are walking in Jesus' light, you will obey with a good attitude the first time they ask.

Sometimes children disobey their parents, even if they try very hard not to. When you disobey, tell God you are sorry and thank Him for Jesus' forgiveness. Ask God to help you walk in Jesus' light. When you disobey, tell your parents you are sorry and ask them to forgive you.

(Show the GF6 picture.) These are pictures of children doing right things. *(Point out the good things the children are doing.)* I want to walk in Jesus' light and obey. Let's sing the new verses to our theme song, "Walking in the Light."

Prayer: Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to shine His light in a selfish, sinful world. I want to walk in the light with Jesus. In Jesus' name, amen.

Bible Adventure for 4's, 5's & K-

(Show the GF1 picture of God the Father and God the Son in heaven.) God the Father is light and God the Son, Jesus, is light, too. God the Father and God the Son are holy and never do anything

wrong. God never disobeys or hates or is selfish. God is holy and cannot have fellowship with any sin. God can't enjoy or have fellowship with people who have selfish sin in their hearts.

Let me give you an example. If you were covered with mud from head to foot, would your mother let you come in the house and have fellowship with her on the couch? Would she sit down with you and not notice the mud that is getting all over the furniture? No. First, she would ask you to take off your muddy clothes and take a bath. Then she would have fellowship with you on the couch.

It's the same thing with God. How can you and I have fellowship with God when we have "muddy" sin in our hearts? God the Son, Jesus, came to earth to clean us up. Jesus showed us how to obey. Jesus always obeyed His heavenly Father. Jesus never did one wrong thing his whole life. Jesus even obeyed when He had to die on the cross. He took the punishment for your sin and mine so that we can fellowship with a holy God.

(Show last week's 1JN01ECGF3 picture.) If you and I believe that Jesus is the light from heaven, then we can walk in His light and have fellowship with God. We can talk to God and have good fellowship with Him.

The Apostle John said in the book of 1 John, "If you are walking in Jesus' light, you will not get into a habit of hating your brother." Hate is anger we have in our hearts that we don't get rid of. If we don't forgive a person who has hurt us, the anger gets worse and becomes hate. It is easy to get mad at our brothers or sisters, but we must quickly forgive them so that we can have fellowship with God and with them.

(Show the GF2 picture.) I'm going to show you three pictures that show people with anger, and perhaps hate, in their hearts. In this picture, the brother has hit his sister. The sister is sad and angry at her brother. If she stays angry and hates her brother, she will not be walking in Jesus' light. God wants the brother to say, "I'm sorry," and He wants the sister to say, "I forgive you."

(This paragraph may be more for the adults teaching the lesson than for the children.) John said, "You can't say that you love God whom you can't see while you hate your brother whom you can see. If you are walking in Jesus' light, you will forgive your brother because Jesus forgives you."

(Show the GF3 picture.) John said, "Don't brag about what you have and what you can do." Bragging about what you have or what you can do does not show off God. It shows off you! God does not want to show you off because then people would try to be like you. God knows that it is only right for people to walk in His light, not in yours. Bragging about yourself does not bring fellowship with God or with other Christians.

(Show the GF4 picture.) When you want what someone else has, you might come to hate them in your heart. Wanting what someone else has is sin and does not help us have fellowship with God or with other people. Tell God you are sorry when you are envious of someone who has something you want.

(Show the GF5 picture.) Disobeying your parents is wrong. You can't have fellowship with God if you have a habit of disobeying your parents without being sorry. Jesus always obeyed His heavenly Father when He was on earth. Jesus always had fellowship and enjoyed talking with His Father, day and night. Even if you don't like what your mom or dad have asked you to do, or even if it doesn't seem fair, if you are walking in Jesus' light, you will obey with a good attitude the first time they ask.

The Apostle John said that when we disobey, as sometimes we will do, we have a way of getting back into fellowship with God and with other people. Tell God you are sorry and thank Him for Jesus' forgiveness. Tell the person you have hurt that you are sorry. Ask God to help you walk in Jesus' light so that you won't stumble and fall into bad attitudes and habits.

(Show the GF6 picture.) These are pictures of children doing right things. *(Point out the good things the children are doing.)* I want to walk in Jesus' light and obey. Let's sing verses three and four of our theme song, "Walking in the Light."

Prayer: Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to shine His light in a selfish, sinful world. I want to walk in the light with Jesus and have fellowship with God. In Jesus' name, amen.



Look:

Aim Questions: Before the Bible Adventure, tape the Aim Questions around the room. After the story, turn out the lights and have the teacher shine one big flashlight on the first question. Ask a child to go get the question. Use the light to guide the child's path back to the teacher where the question is read and answered by flashlight.

"Walking in the Light" Marching: Pass out a flashlight to each child and march around the darkened room while singing "Walking in the Light." The older children could go single file while the younger children could march to the open (or darker) areas of the room.

"If We Walk in the Light" Game: Show a picture (1JN01ECGF1) to the children and tell them that the lights will be turned off. Give each child a flashlight and tell them they are to look for that picture with their flashlights. When they find the picture, they are to quietly shine their flashlight on it until the whole class can join them to show how much brighter the picture becomes with everyone there. Turn off the lights and place the picture on the floor. After everyone has found the picture, repeat again with the picture posted somewhere on a wall or taped to a leader. "Today's Bible Adventure taught us that Jesus is the light and we can be friends with Jesus and have fellowship with Him when we are in the light."

Foot Painting: Place tempera paint on a cookie sheet on the floor at one end of a large piece of butcher paper. At the other end, have a large bucket (or two) of water and several towels. Each child takes off his shoes, steps in the paint and carefully walks to the other end of the paper. First ask the child if he wants to walk with Jesus in His light, doing right his whole life. Sing one of the verses of "Walking in the Light" as the child walks.

Walking in the Light Attitudes: (1JN02ECGF6) This picture is being sent home with the children as part of the Preschool Page for Parents. As the children color their GF6 pages, talk about the situations in the pictures. Talk about what their jobs are at their own homes. Perhaps they have different jobs than the ones represented in the pictures. Reinforce the fact that children must always obey their parents without whining or waiting. Sing verses three and four of "Walking in the Light."

Paper Doll Chain: (1JN02ECGF7) Talk about what fellowship means and what you do to have it by obeying, saying you are sorry, not bragging, and not envying. As you do this, cut out and let the children color a paper doll chain which represents you in fellowship with others. Say the memory verse as the children color the dolls or children to represent themselves and a friend. Review the Aim Questions, also.

④ **Scripture Verse Review Puzzle:** Before class, print the words of the memory verse in large letters and cut out each individual word using interesting shapes. Outline the words as they appear in the verse onto a large poster board. After the Bible Adventure, scatter the individual words on the floor and ask the children one at a time to come up and choose a word to fit onto the puzzle posterboard. Read the words as they are chosen. Repeat the whole verse several times after it is completed.

④ **Light & Dark Situations: (1JN02ECGF8)** Use the following situations with the "Walking in the Light with Jesus" triangle game board. Cut these situations apart and let a child choose one of them from a bag. Read the situation to the children. If they did that particular good thing last week, they can move their hearts one space toward Jesus. If the children did one of the bad things last week, they move their hearts one step backwards. The object of the game is to get closer to Jesus' light. For the heart-shaped game piece, get a wooden heart at a craft store and let children paint them with tempera paint.

You hurt your brother.

You hit your sister.

You helped feed your baby sister.

You ate all your food when asked to.

You did your job of feeding the cat.

You were mean to your friend.

You didn't go to bed when asked.

You obeyed your mom.

You obeyed your dad.

You wanted a game that you saw at your friend's house.

You said, "Ha, ha, I win. You are the loser!"

You said, "I sure wish I could have a bike like Jason's."

You said, "I hate you."

You said, "I'm glad you won."

You hugged your friend.

You said, "I love you, Mommy."

You said, "I love you, Daddy."

④ **Mother May I?** Using situations above, tell a child that they obeyed so they get to take two steps forward. The child says, "Mother may I?" and you say, "Yes you may." You might say, "You didn't

go to bed when asked so you take three steps backwards." See who gets to the other side of the room first.

④ **Situation Sorting:** Place the above situations on individual papers in a basket. A child pulls one out, you read it, and he places it in one of two coffee cans, depending on whether it represents walking in the light with Jesus or in your sin in darkness. Cover one coffee can with light paper and the other with dark paper.

④ **Memory Verse Review:** Play the whisper game by saying the memory verse in two parts. Whisper the first half of the verse to the child on your right and the child on your left and see how it comes out in the middle. Repeat with the second half of the verse.

 **"Walking in the Light with Jesus" Sticker Picture: (1JN02ECGF9 and 1JN02ECGF10)** Talk about how we walk in Jesus' light when we believe in Jesus and obey what He tells us in the Bible. Let the children put their GF10 Bible stickers (which can be copied onto 1" x 2 5/8" laser labels) on their GF9 pictures. We have fellowship with God and with other people when we say we are sorry for the wrong things we do. Let the children put an "I'm sorry" sticker on the page. Sing the "Walking in the Light" verses together and practice the memory verse together.

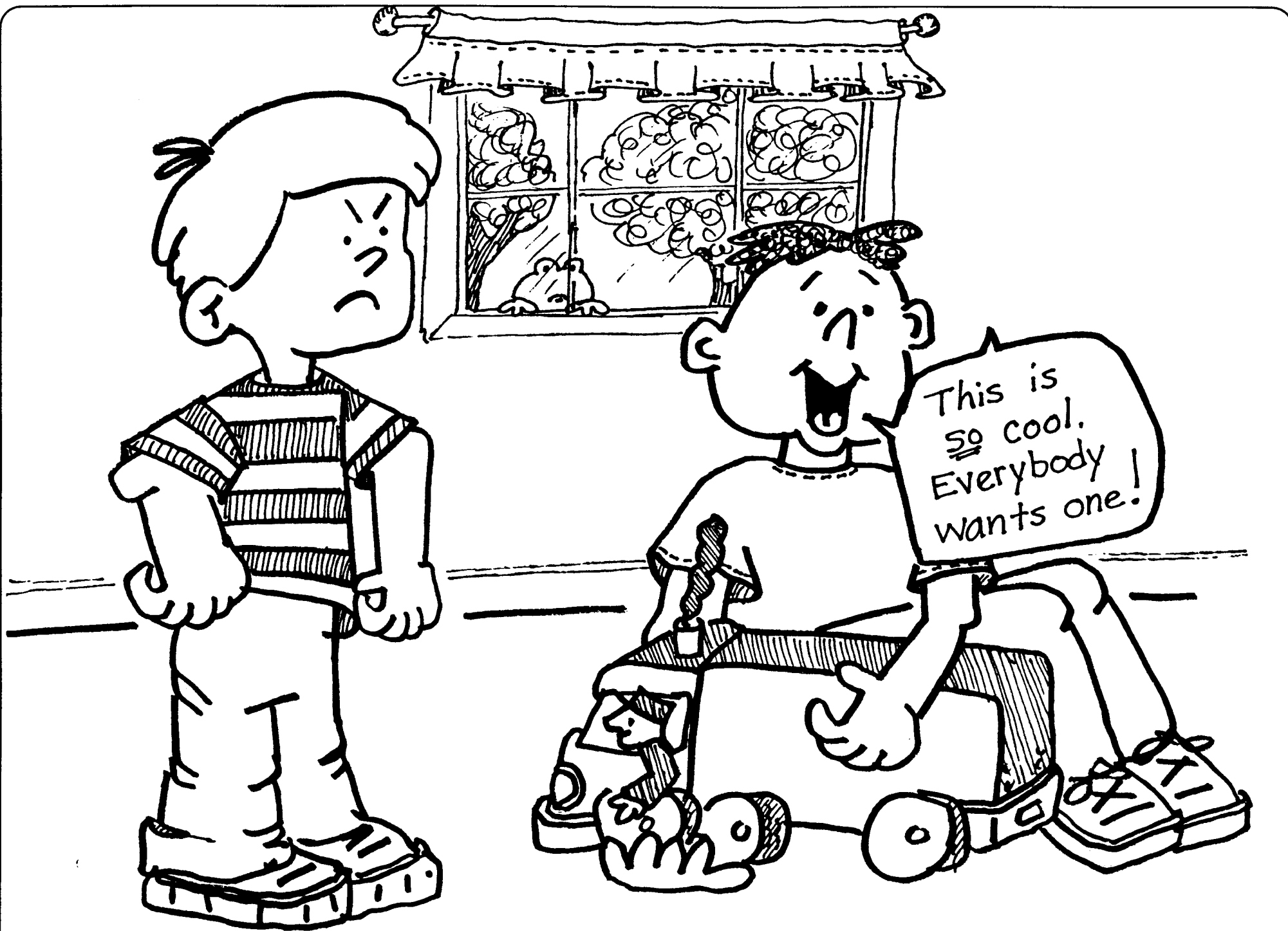

This is what I learned today!

The children heard today that God is holy and can never do anything wrong. God cannot have any fellowship with sin (darkness), or with people who have disobedience in their hearts. Jesus showed us how to obey because He always obeyed His heavenly Father.

God is concerned not only with outward obedience but with the attitudes we have in our hearts. John continued to write in his letter, "If you are walking in Jesus' light, you will not hate your brother" (1 John 2:10). Hate is anger we have in our hearts that we don't get rid of. If we don't forgive a person who has hurt us, the anger festers and becomes hate. We must quickly forgive others so that we can have fellowship with God and with them. We are to tell God we are sorry for our bad attitudes and thank Him for Jesus' forgiveness.

Obey with a Good Attitude Bingo Game



Give each of your children a copy of the set of pictures on the back side of this page. Cut apart a set for yourself and put them in a bag. Give each child a small cup of fruit loops (Cheerios, buttons, M&M's), a few with which to play the game and a few for a snack. As you pull a picture from a bag, the children will put a Cheerio on the picture that matches yours. Talk about how Jesus wants us to do the right thing with a good attitude. If we fail, we should say we are sorry and ask Him to forgive us. Ask the children to practice asking for forgiveness. Lead them in saying, "Dear God, I am sorry for. . . Thank You for forgiving me. Help me do the right thing."

For fun, let the children string the fruit loops onto a long piece of yarn to make a necklace. Put a small piece of masking or scotch tape around the end of the yarn so that the children can put it through the cereal. Cut the pictures apart, punch a hole in the top of each, and string them on the necklace.

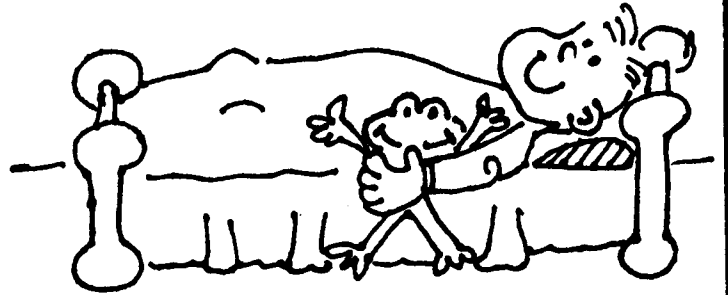
