Memory Verse:

The Lord Himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you.
Deuteronomy 31:8

Attribute of God emphasized in this lesson: God keeps His promise to stay with His people.

Aim Questions for 2's & 3's:

1. **Did God faithfully stay with the Israelites in the desert?** *(Yes. He led them in the cloud.)*
2. **Did God faithfully take care of the Israelites in the desert?** *(Yes. God sent manna and water every day in the desert.)*
3. **Was the land of Canaan a good land full of milk and honey?** *(Yes)*
4. **Did Moses tell the Israelites to remember to obey all of God's commands when they went to Canaan?** *(Yes--Numbers 15:40)*
5. **Does God promise to stay with His people?** *(Yes. Review the last part of the memory verse.)*

Aim Questions for 4's, 5's & K:

1. **How did God faithfully take care of the Israelites in the desert for forty years?** *(God led His people by the cloud and sent manna for forty years in the desert.)*
2. **Can you trace the path of the Israelites from Egypt to the land of Canaan?** *Put stickers on the different places where God led the Israelites.)*
3. **What did God want the Israelites to remember when they went to Canaan?** *(God wanted the Israelites to remember, and to teach their children to remember, all His commands, His miracles, and His promise to be with them.)*
4. **Did God promise to go with the Israelites to the land of Canaan?** *(Yes. Review the memory verse.)*
5. **Does God promise to stay with His people?** *(Yes)*

Key for symbols:

- This box symbol represents ideas that can be used for two-year-olds through kindergarten. Please remember to slow down the pace for two-year-olds and keep the pace moving for five-year-olds.
- ② This symbol represents ideas that are best used for two- and three-year-olds.
- ④ This symbol represents ideas that are best used for four-year-olds through kindergarten.

Hook:

- Foot Path:** Place a strip of butcher paper on the floor and let the children trace around each others' feet, making a path along the paper. Talk about the Israelites' path through the desert. The children are going to follow this path together in the Bible Adventure today.
- Foot Patterns:** Trace around the children's feet and let them tear the tracings out and tape them to the floor, making a trail around the room. Talk about the Israelites and their journey in the desert.

- Traveling Israelites:** Tie a strip of fabric around the head of each child. Pretend to be Israelites, packing, setting up tents, sleeping on the ground, picking up manna, cooking manna, eating manna, packing up tents, traveling and following the cloud. The children get to follow the Israelites on their trip from Egypt to the promised land in Canaan in the Bible Adventure today.
- Shoe Center:** Provide a variety of shoes for children to try on. Talk about traveling to different places and wearing different shoes. Remind the children of how God kept the Israelites' sandals from wearing out while they were walking for forty years in the desert sands. Pretend to be walking in sand with different shoes on.
- Picture Hopscotch Center:** Line up the following review pictures on the floor. The younger children can take one giant step from one picture to the next while the older ones might jump or hop. Have them stand balanced on each picture while the leader reads.
- 1EXO03ECGF3, 4, or 5:** (Frogs, flies or another plague picture) Have a child stand on this picture while the leader says, "God says, 'I will take you out of Egypt.'"
- 1EXO05ECGF3:** (Israelites walking through Red Sea) A child moves to the next picture and the leader says, "God showed His power and divided the waters."
- 1EXO06ECGF1:** (Manna) As a child moves onto this picture, the leader says, "God sent food from heaven called manna."
- 1EXO06ECGF2:** (Rock) A child moves forward again and the leader says, "God made sweet water come from the rock."
- 1EXO08ECGF5:** (Stone tablets) A child moves forward and the leader says, "God wrote His ten laws down on two stone tables for the Israelites."
- 1DEU01ECGF3:** (Men carrying huge grapes) When the child moves to this picture the leader says: "The land of Canaan was good just as God had promised the Israelites."
- 1NUM04ECGF4:** (Map of homes built by Reuben, Gad and Manasseh) The child moves to the last picture while the leader says, "The Israelites built homes in the new land that God had given them." After the pictures, the child could jump into a bean bag chair or onto a large pillow (to represent God in the cloud) while the leader says, "God was with His people in the cloud over the desert every day and night for forty years, and always took care of them."
- Bowling Over False Idols:** Set up a toy bowling set or use empty milk cartons and a small ball. Have a child stand behind a tape mark line on the floor and roll the ball at the pins (false idols) to see how many can be knocked down at one time. In the Bible, God told the Israelite people, "You shall have no other gods before Me."
- "Don't Take Someone Else's Belongings":** Two children sit cross-legged on the floor facing each other. A bean bag is placed between them. Their hands should rest on their knees. A leader says, "Reach," and both children reach for the bag. Try several times and with different opponents. In today's Bible Adventure, God will tell His people, "Don't take things which belong to someone else." Explain that the bean bag doesn't belong to either child, but the game is to give an idea of grabbing for something.
- ② **Do Not Lie! Center:** Have the leader say the following lines and the small group responds by saying, "Do not lie!" The children could shake their fingers or pound their fists as they say the words.

- One of God's laws to the Israelites was, "Do not lie."
- ④ **Map on a Sheet: (1DEU01ECGF1)** Draw the map on a large sheet. Let children use markers and color the objects you have drawn along the road.

- ④ **Play Dough:** Roll out play dough on the table top and give children popsicle sticks to mark a road as if making a map. Draw some grapes, sad faces, chariot wheels, foot prints, etc., on the map.

- ④ **Travel Pictures and Remembering:** Using old magazines, let children find travel pictures that help them remember a trip they have taken. Tell them that we are going to remember the trip the Israelites took through the desert from Egypt to Canaan.
- ④ **Dodge the Newspaper Wads:** Provide a box of wadded up newspaper. If the children help make the wads, provide some “wipes” for their black hands! Choose a “Moses” to be in the center of the circle of children. The rest of the children try to hit Moses with a wad of newspaper as the teacher passes the box around. Anyone who tags Moses gets to take his place in the center and the former Moses can be the next person to pass the box around. Stop occasionally and pick up the newspapers. Talk about how the Israelites grumbled and complained to Moses because they wanted different food and water in the desert.

Book:

Presentation Ideas -

- Color and mount the **1DEU01ECGF1**, **1DEU01ECGF2**, and **1DEU01ECGF3** pictures on construction paper. Show them as you tell the Bible Adventure. Save them for review throughout the book of Deuteronomy.
- Wear sandals today as you talk about walking through the desert.
- Show the children a picture of the stone tablets with the Ten Commandments on them. Ask them if they remember what the laws were or what God said. Then show the children in your Bible where the same words that were on the tablets that God wrote are in our Bibles for us today. Read the words to the children. Talk about how important these were for the Israelites to follow and how important they are for us to follow. God is going to talk about these tablets and His words or commandments again in today’s Bible Adventure.
- This lesson is basically a review lesson. So that the children do not get restless, use many objects or review pictures from the Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers lessons.

Bible Adventure for 2’s & 3’s-

(Hold up a paper cloud taped to a stick that represents God leading His people in the desert.) God was faithful to lead the Israelites to the land of Canaan. He led them in the cloud during the day and in the fire at night. As the Israelites waited to go into the new land, Moses had many things to tell them.

(Enlarge the GF1 map by drawing it freehand on a large piece of butcher paper. It does not need to be exact. Place it in the center of the story circle so that all the children can see it. Place a small carton of milk, a bottle of honey, and some grapes on the Canaan area of the map.) Moses said, “God made a promise to you. He said He would be with you and would give you a good land that is full of milk, honey, and grapes.”

(Put a toy frog, grasshopper, or bug on the Egypt area of the map.) God said, “I will take you out of Egypt,” and He sent frogs, bugs, and hail (or whatever plague you emphasized) so that Pharaoh would let God’s people go worship Him on the mountain.

(Show the GF2 picture.) God was powerful and kept His people safe when the Egyptian chariots tried to take the people back to Egypt. The Israelites walked safely through the water but the water rushed back and covered the Egyptian chariots.

(Place a small loaf of bread on the map in the area where the woman is gathering manna.) The Israelites began grumbling in the desert. They said, “God is not with us. We’re hungry!” *(Have everyone say, “We’re hungry,” with a whiny voice.)*

God sent food from heaven, called manna. God was keeping His promise to be with His people. He promised that He would never leave them.

(Place a small bottle of water or a rock on the area around Rephidim. Pour a little water on the rock.) The Israelites got thirsty in the hot desert and said, “God is not with us. We’re thirsty!” *(Have everyone say, “We’re thirsty,” with a whiny voice.)* God made sweet water come from the rock so that all the Israelites drank cool, fresh water. God was keeping His promise. He said, “I will never leave you.”

(Place a small box with two rock “tablets” in it on the Mount Sinai region.) God wrote His ten laws down on two stone tablets for the Israelites so that they would know how to be holy as God is holy. God

said, "You shall have no other gods before me; obey your father and mother; don't lie; and don't take what belongs to someone else."

(Place little figures, such as Fisher-Price people, on the area close to Canaan.) The Israelites were getting close to the promised land of Canaan. When Moses sent the twelve men over to look at the new land, the men brought back huge grapes from the good land.

(Show the GF3 picture.) Joshua and Caleb said, "God will keep His promise to be with us. Let's not be afraid." The other ten men said, "There are giants who are too strong for us." The Israelites all cried and said, "We're afraid that God will not be with us." *(Have everyone say, "We're afraid," with a whiny voice.)*

(Begin walking the miniature people away from Canaan.) Because the Israelites didn't trust God to keep His promise, they had to walk in the desert for forty years. God sent manna every day from heaven and never left His people, but they could not go to the promised land.

(Walk the miniature people through Edom and Moab to the area east of the Jordan River.) Now the young Israelites were ready to go to Canaan. Moses wanted to make sure that they would remember all of God's words.

Moses said, "Teach your children and grandchildren about God. Tell them about all the miracles God did for you. Talk about God when you sit at home and when you walk along the road. Talk about Him when you go to bed and when you get up. Don't ever forget that God keeps His promises." *(Sing, "Talk About God," slowly several times.)*

We want you to talk about God, too. Let's pray to God right now.

Prayer: Dear God, You kept Your promise to be with the Israelites in the desert, giving them food and water. You keep Your promise to be with us, too. Thank You, in Jesus' name, Amen.

Bible Adventure for 4's, 5's & K-

(Enlarge the GF1 map by drawing it freehand on a large piece of butcher paper. It does not need to be exact. Place it in the center of the story circle so that all the children can see it. Place a small carton of milk, a bottle of honey, and some grapes on the land of Canaan area.) While the Israelites were waiting to go into the land of Canaan, Moses talked to the people.

Moses said, "God made a promise to you. He said He would be with you and would give you a good land that is full of milk, honey, and grapes."

(Place a brick or whip made of ropes on the area marked "Egypt." Place a toy frog, grasshopper, or bug on the area of Egypt.) God said, "I will take you out of slavery in Egypt," and He sent frogs, bugs, and hail so that the Pharaoh would let God's people go worship Him on the mountain.

(Show the GF2 picture.) God was powerful and kept His people safe when the Egyptian chariots tried to take the people back to Egypt. The Israelites walked safely through the water but the water rushed back and covered the Egyptian chariots.

(Place a small loaf of bread on the map in the area where the woman is gathering manna.) The Israelites began grumbling in the desert. They said, "God is not with us. We're hungry! Take us back to Egypt." *(Have everyone say, "We're hungry," with a whiny voice.)*

God sent food from heaven, didn't He? What was the food called? That's right, manna. God was keeping His promise to be with His people and take care of them.

(Place a small bottle of water or a big rock on the area around Rephidim. Pour a little water on the rock.) The Israelites got thirsty in the hot desert and said, "God is not with us. We're thirsty! Take us back to Egypt." *(Have everyone say, "We're thirsty," with a whiny voice.)* God made sweet water come from the rock so that all the Israelites had water. God was keeping His promise, that He would never leave them.

(Place a small box with two rock "tablets" in it on the Mount Sinai region.) God wrote His law down on two stone tablets for the Israelites so that they would know how to be holy as God is holy. Who remembers some of the Ten Commandments? "You shall have no other gods before me; you shall not worship idols; you must obey your father and mother; you must not lie; you must not want something that belongs to someone else; and you must not take what belongs to someone else." God said, "Remember to obey all of these commands."

(Place little figures, such as Fisher-Price people, on the area close to Canaan.) When the Israelites came close to the promised land of Canaan, Moses sent the twelve men over to look at the new land. The explorers brought back huge grapes from the good land.

(Show the GF3 picture.) Joshua and Caleb said, "God will keep His promise to be with us. Let's not be afraid." The other ten men said, "There are giants who are too strong for us." The Israelites all cried

and said, "We're afraid that God will not be with us." (*Have everyone say, "We're afraid," with a whiny voice.*)

(*Begin walking the miniature people away from Canaan.*) Because the Israelites didn't trust God to keep His promise, they had to stay in the desert for forty years until all of the adults had died. God stayed with them and sent manna every day from heaven. God kept the Israelites' sandals and clothes from wearing out.

(*Move the miniature figures up toward Ezion Geber.*) The Israelites walked and walked. When they came to the land of Edom, God said to Moses, "Don't take any land from Edom because they are the descendants of Esau. I have given them that land." So the Israelites paid for any food or water they ate, and walked on through the land of Edom.

When the Israelites came to the land of Moab, God said, "Don't take any land from Moab because I have given the land to the descendants of Lot." The Israelites obeyed and left Moab to the people of Lot.

(*Walk the miniature people to the area east of the Jordan River.*) When the Israelites came to the region of Heshbon, the Lord said, "You may take this land," and the men of Reuben, Gad, and Manasseh fought and won the land. They began building their homes there.

Moses knew that it would soon be time for him to go up on the mountain to die, as God had said. Moses wanted to make sure that the young Israelites would remember God's words. He said, "If you love the Lord God with all your heart, as Caleb and Joshua do, you will teach your children about God's love. Tell them about all the miracles God has done for you. Talk with them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road. Talk about God when you go to bed and when you get up. Don't ever forget that God keeps His promises. Don't ever forget that God will be with you. He will never leave you."

Moses said, "If you remember to obey all of God's commands, then you will have strength to go into the land of Canaan." (*Sing, "Talk About God," slowly several times.*)

We want you to talk about God, too. Let's pray to God right now.

Prayer: Dear God, You kept Your promise to be with the Israelites in the desert, giving them food and water. You keep Your promise to be with us, too. Thank You, in Jesus' name, Amen.



Look:



Map and Stickers Review: (1DEU01ECGF1 and 1DEU01ECGF7) Along the travel line on the map, let children place GF7 stickers in appropriate places, matching pictures. The GF7 page can be copied onto 1" X 2 5/8" laser labels to make the stickers.



Aim Questions: Number and write the Aim Questions on small pieces of paper. Tape them onto five of the articles that you have placed on the oversized map during the Bible Adventure. Choose a child to get the first question and bring that article from the floor map to the teacher to read. Repeat for all the questions.



Snack: Serve flattened circles of white bread. It could be sweetened with a little honey before being served. Ask the children if they are tired of eating the "manna" yet. Discuss the Israelites grumbling about getting only manna every morning to eat. Remind the children that it was proof that God was with them and never left them. Only God could provide the manna.



Obey Your Father and Mother: Have a leader stand in front of the class which is spaced out around the play area. Use the rules for "Simon Says" only use, "Mother says," or "Father says," before each command. Each time the command is not preceded by "Mother says," or "Father says," the child sits down and stands up before continuing to play. Some suggestions might be: "Stand on one foot. Jump and turn around. Clap three times. Lie on your back and kick in the air. Frown. Pound your fists together. Slap your heel with your hand. Clap behind your back. Rub your tummy. Do arm circles. Touch your toes. Yawn. Jump your feet apart and together. Grumble, grumble." One of the laws that God gave His people was that they were to obey their fathers and mothers.



Marching: Put on some good marching music and have the children march to all areas of the room. Encourage them to carry as many items (toys, stuffed animals, dolls) as they can while they march to remind them that the Israelites took all of their belongings with them while they traveled in the desert for forty years. Who could carry the most items?



"Land of the Giants" Center: Provide several soft balls and a target on the wall (outline of an adult giant). Have the children stand five to ten feet away from the wall and throw the balls at the target.

When Moses sent twelve men to explore the land of Canaan, ten of them came back and told the Israelites that the people in Canaan were like giants because they were so big and strong.


- ② **"On to Canaan" Game:** Needed: Large play area outside with an area marked off (rope on the ground) to represent Egypt. Joshua and Caleb (two leaders) stand with their backs to the class about twenty yards in front of the class which is standing in "Egypt." They say, "Come with us to Canaan!" and motion forward with their arms. The class slowly sneaks up on them and at some point an "Israelite" (teaching leader) answers, "We're too afraid!" at which time Joshua and Caleb turn around and carefully try to catch (tag) an Israelite before he can make it back to "Egypt." The caught "Israelites" wait with Joshua and Caleb while the game is repeated a couple of times.
- ④ **Verse Along the Foot Path:** After discussing and going over the memory verse, repeat it while following a leader along the foot path the children made during Hook time. Connect the ends of the paper path with a masking tape trail to follow when not on footprints.
-
- ④ **Map Review:** Place the "map on a sheet" (See the Hook section.) on the floor in the middle of the circle of children. Ask a child to stand on the map in the following places: where the Egyptians experienced the plagues, where God covered the Egyptians' chariots with water in the Red Sea, where the Israelites grumbled, where God provided manna and water, where God gave the Ten Commandments, where twelve men went into Canaan, where the Israelites wandered forty years, and where Moses asked them to remember. Repeat with more children so they all get a turn.
- ④ **Snack: (1DEU01ECGF6)** Eat a simple snack to represent manna (soda crackers, white bread, sugar cookies). Place a sample clock like the one they will make later to take home ("Obeying All Day Long" from Took section) in the center of the table. As you move the hand to a different time of the day, ask the children what they would be doing at home. Also discuss how they can talk about God and Jesus at this time. Go over the memory verse.
- ④ **Bible Adventure Review:** Using the map sheet from the Hook section, let the children take turns tossing bean bags onto it and telling what happened to the Israelites where their bag lands. If it lands off of an object on the map, use this as an opportunity to review the memory verse together.
- ④ **Singing Review:** Sing together, "Praise Him, praise Him, all ye little children. God is good. God is good." Stop and let the children tell you something they remember about God in the Bible Adventure. Occasionally stop and say the memory verse together.
- ④ **Moses Toss:** Divide the children into two teams. Assign one on each team to be "Moses." He stands facing his team as they stand around him. He holds a two-liter bottle which has had the bottom cut off of it, leaving a cone in his hand so the opening is on top. The team members have newspapers to wad into a ball and try to get into the bottle in the hand of their "Moses." When one wad gets in, Moses calls out, "One," and drops it to the floor so another can go in. The first team to get ten in is the winner. Talk about God giving the Israelites ten commandments to remember and obey.
- ④ **Follow the Leader:** Select a child to be the leader and choose a certain action for the other children to follow as they march around the room following him. Talk about the Israelites following Moses through the desert, complaining, eating and drinking what God provided, meeting enemies, paying as they went, taking enemies, etc.
- ④ **Object Picture Review:** Place items and pictures relating to the Bible Adventure story today in a bag and ask children to come up one at a time, pull out an item, and tell how they remember it in the story today. Include things like a sandal, a jar of manna, a picture of a chariot, grapes, bricks, a jar of water, a frog, a picture of tablets, a picture of a house being built, etc.

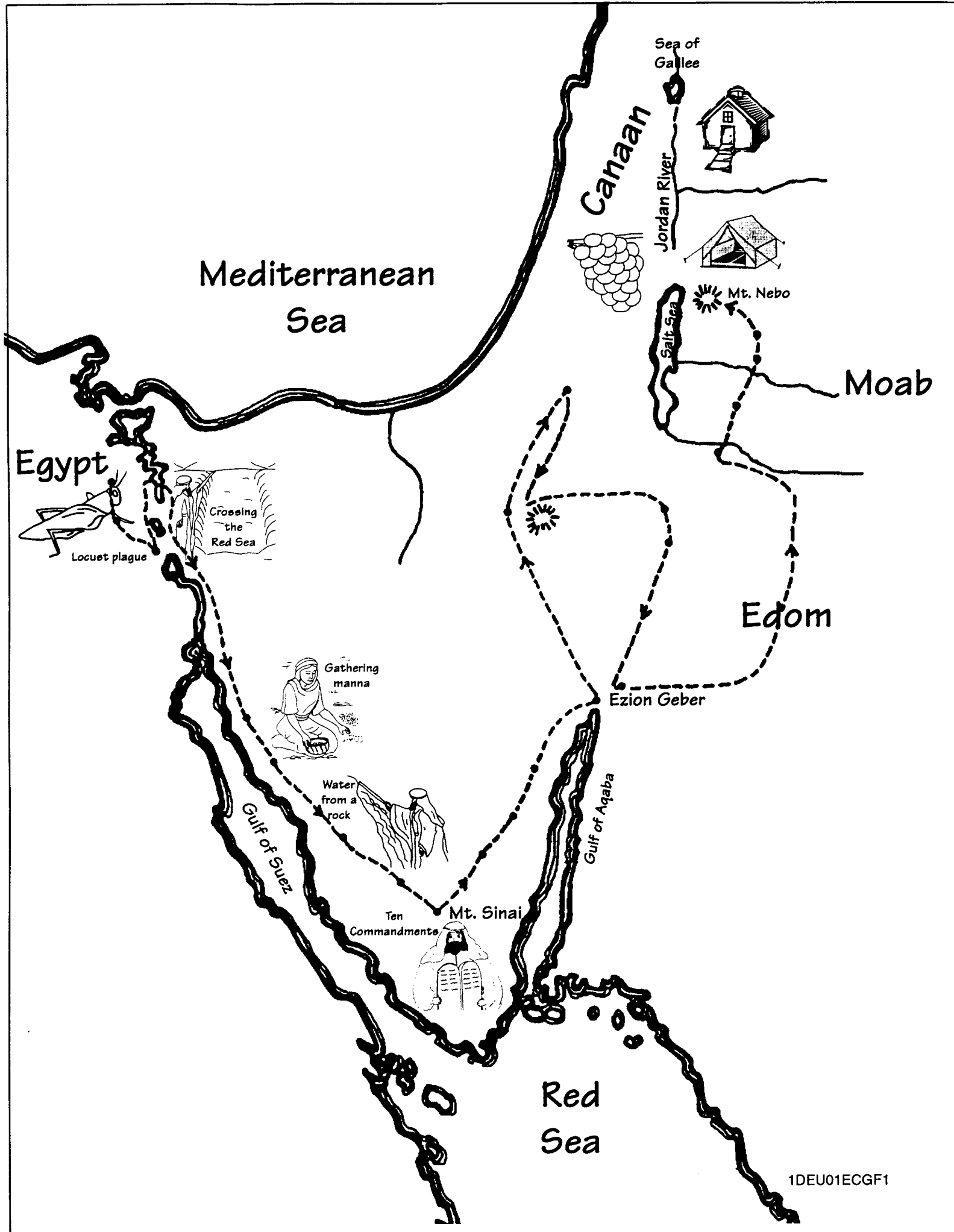

Took:

 **God's Laws Headband: (1DEU01ECGF4 and 1DEU01ECGF5)** Copy one set of GF4 tablets per student and cut them out. Cut a one-inch wide by twenty-two-inch long strip of heavy paper (poster board). Have the children decorate the strip with crayons or with glue and glitter. Paste or tape one set of the tablets to the center of the twenty-two-inch strip after it is decorated. The children can stick GF5 stickers around the sides of their headband. (The GF5 page can be copied onto 1" X 2 5/8" laser labels to make stickers.) Measure the band to the child's head and tape it closed for the correct size. The children can wear their headbands to help them remember God's words.

④ **Obeying All Day Long! (1DEU01ECGF6 and 1DEU01ECGF7)** Give each child a GF6 page with the clock on it. Attach the hour hand with a brad paper fastener. Place GF7 stickers all over the clock to remind the children to talk about the Bible Adventure. The GF7 page can be copied onto 1" X 2 5/8" laser labels to make stickers. Discuss talking about the Bible during the whole day.

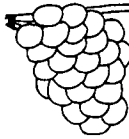

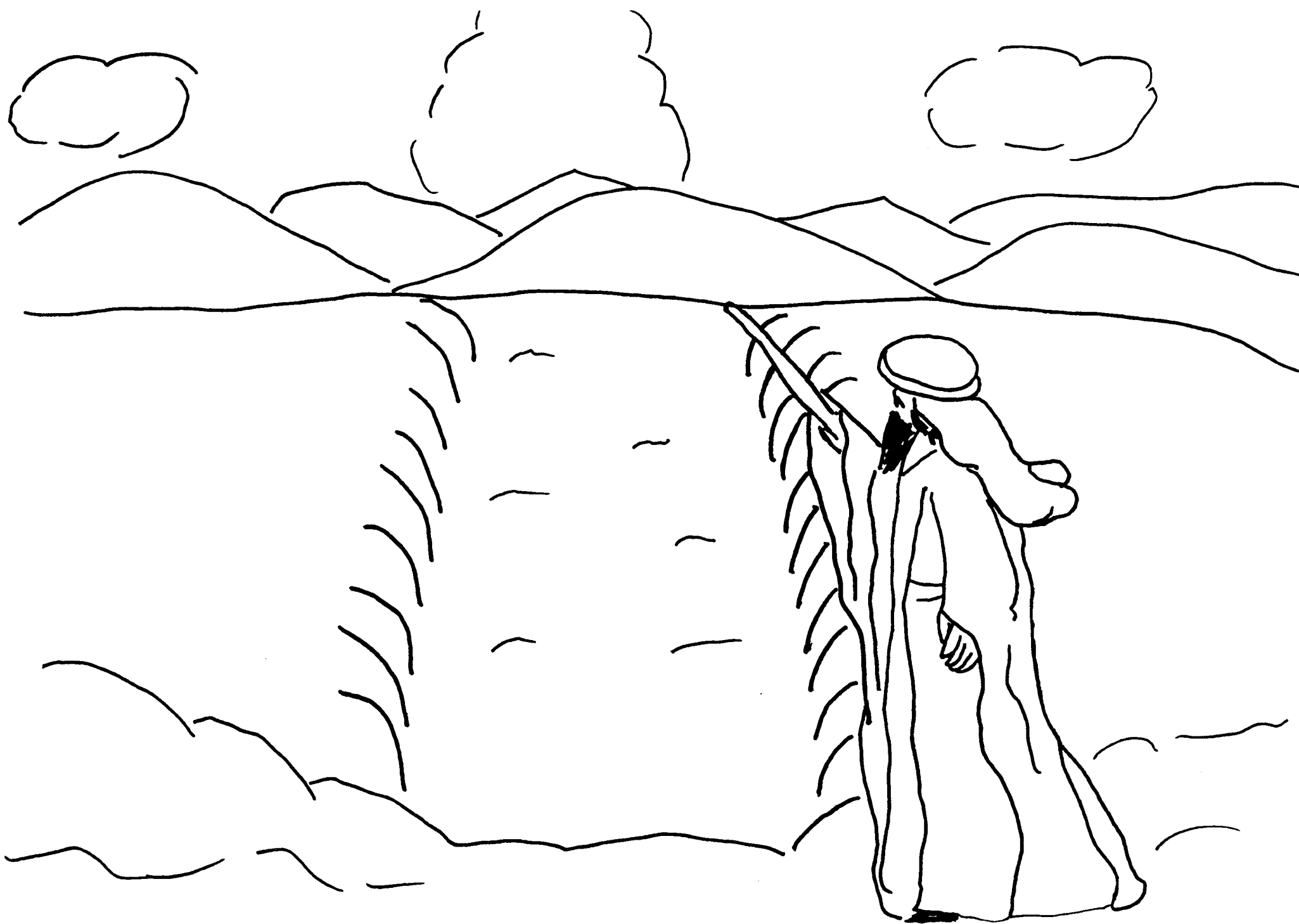

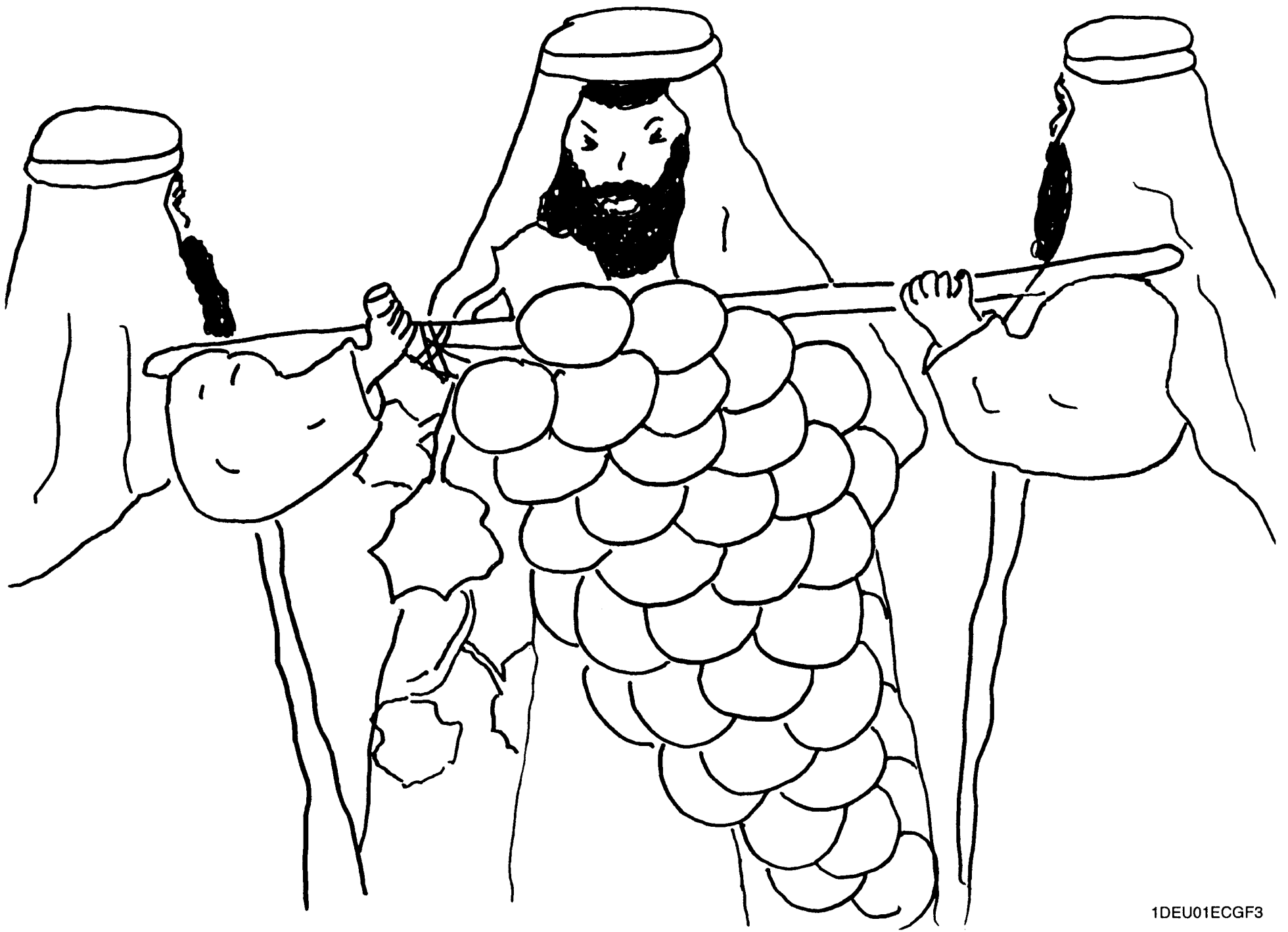

Obeying All Day Long

Copy one clock per child on card stock paper. Cut out the clock and minute hand. Attach the hand to the clock on the "X" and talk about what the children do throughout the day. Place Bible stickers on the clock to remind the children to talk about what they are learning in the Bible.
