God Sent Plagues on Egypt.

Materials I Need:

Memory Verse:

I will take you as My own people, and I will be your God. Exodus 6:7

Attribute of God emphasized in this lesson: God has power over all things.

Aim Questions for 2's & 3's:

1. Did God tell Moses to tell Pharaoh to let His people go? (Yes)
2. Did Pharaoh say, "No," to God? (Yes)
3. Did God turn the water red, and send frogs, gnats, flies, disease to animals, boils, hail, grasshoppers, and darkness to Egypt? (Yes. Show the pictures.)
4. Who has power over all things? (God)
5. Were the Israelites God's people? (Yes. Say the memory verse.)

Aim Questions for 4's, 5's & K:

1. What did God ask Moses to tell Pharaoh? (God said, "Let My people go.")
2. What did Pharaoh say? (Pharaoh said, "No, no, they can't go.")
3. What were the nine things that God did to show His power? (Show pictures as you tell how God turned the water into blood, sent frogs, gnats, flies, disease to animals, boils, hail, grasshoppers, and darkness to Egypt.)
4. Why did God send plagues to the Egyptians but not to the Israelites? (God wanted everyone to know that He was the Israelites' God and they were His people.)
5. Who has power over all things? (God)

Key for symbols:

- This box symbol represents ideas that can be used for two-year-olds through kindergarten. Please remember to slow down the pace for two-year-olds and keep the pace moving for five-year-olds.
- ② This symbol represents ideas that are best used for two- and three-year-olds.
- ④ This symbol represents ideas that are best used for four-year-olds through kindergarten.



Hook:

- Lesson Review:** Look over last week's Look section and use one or more activities for review during today's Hook time. Incorporate last week's pictures to remind the children what they have been learning in the book of Exodus.
- Turning the River Red:** Slowly drop red food coloring into a shallow bowl of water and watch as it slowly spreads. Add more food coloring until the water is "blood" red. Today's Bible Adventure tells of God turning a whole river bright red.
- Rhythm Sticks:** Give each child just one rhythm stick. Have the children follow you in tapping it on the floor to the rhythm of their names and the memory verse today. Include words that they will hear in the Bible Adventure, like Moses, Aaron, Pharaoh, Egypt, worship, obey, no, work, work harder,

Israelites, God, Nile River, red, frogs, gnats, flies, hard heart, dead, sores, hail, lightning, grasshoppers, darkness, and mighty power.

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- Play Dough:** This is a good day to make bugs of all kinds. Let the children use their imaginations and make up names for their bugs. See how many of the plagues you can form from play dough.
- ② **Plague of Frogs:** Before the children arrive, hide pictures of frogs in their different play areas. As they find the frogs, have them take them to the leaders. Talk about Egypt being covered with frogs and how they got into everything! After all (or most) of the frogs are found, they can be counted by the children. In the Bible Adventure, God showed His mighty power by covering all the land of Egypt with frogs.
- ② **In the Dark:** Provide a large, dark-colored blanket that can be draped over two or three chairs to make a dark area in the room. Encourage the children to go into the dark alone or in small groups. The Bible Adventure tells of God making it dark for three days and three nights in the land of Egypt so that people could not go out of their houses. But all of God's people in that land had light where they lived.
- ② **Swat the Flies:** Tie a small, light object (plastic bug, cork) onto the end of a string. Give a couple of children plastic fly swatters and ask them to trap the "fly" under their swatter. The leader then pulls one or two strings around the room but stops if someone is able to trap the "fly." Today's Bible Adventure showed God's mighty power when He covered the land of Egypt with flies.
- ④ **Jump Over the River:** With a teacher on each end of two ropes and children lined up on one side, ask them to jump over the river. Begin with a narrow river and as it widens, the children have to jump harder to get to the other side without getting wet! Moses is going to find the Egyptian Pharaoh down by a river in the Bible Adventure story from the book of Exodus today.
- ④ **Counting the Plagues: (1EXO03ECGF11)** Place nine copies of the small pictures of each plague in the center of the table. Ask a child to choose one and try to find eight other pictures of the same plague so that they have nine in all. When done, all the pictures go to the center of the table and the children choose a different one. Older children could see who could find all nine first. Moses will tell how God made all nine of these things happen right where the Egyptians were living with the Pharaoh.
- ④ **Puppet Talk:** Using two puppets, have one ask the other to get something for him to which he replies, "No." Change the request several times and have the response always be "No." In the end the "No" puppet gets in trouble for his wrong attitude. "The Pharaoh said, 'No,' nine times and he will get in trouble for it. Listen and find out what happens to the Pharaoh."
- ④ **Follow the Leader:** With each child holding a rhythm stick, select one child to be the leader and have the others follow him in touching things with his stick (tapping the floor, head, back, chair, table, a friend's knee, etc.).
- ④ **Plague Statues:** Tell the children to act out a plague until the music stops. The children are to freeze and laugh at each other. This would be good to do before the story to get the "wiggles" out.
- ④ **Egg Carton Numbers:** The children will be hearing about nine different things that happened to Pharaoh in the Bible Adventure today. Write a number (one through twelve) in the bottom of each cup of an egg carton. Give each child a sandwich bag with Cheerios in it. Ask one child to put the correct number of cereal pieces in each cup. Ask her to remove them and put nine in the number nine cup. "This is the number of bad things that are going to happen in Egypt. I wonder what kinds of bad things they will be." Variation: Place a miniature marshmallow in the egg carton, close the top and shake it until it lands in the number nine space.



### **Book:**

#### **Presentation Ideas -**

- Treasure Box Object:** The object for the Treasure Box for this lesson is a plastic frog. Request one for your class from the Children's Department. Before the Bible Adventure, sing the first verse of one of the two songs that tell the story of Exodus (See the Song section.) as you take a Bible out of the Treasure Box. Let a child open the Bible to the Book of Exodus as you sing the review verses of the

song. After the Bible Adventure, take the plastic frog out of the Treasure Box and sing the new verse of the song.

- Hold a stick, staff, cane, or rhythm stick as you stretch out your hand as Aaron did when God sent the plagues.
- Each time a new plague is added to the Bible Adventure, let the children count to the number of the plague with you.
- Color and mount the **1EXO03ECGF1, 1EXO03ECGF2, 1EXO03ECGF3, 1EXO03ECGF4, 1EXO03ECGF5, 1EXO03ECGF6, 1EXO03ECGF7, 1EXO03ECGF8, 1EXO03ECGF9, and 1EXO03ECGF10** pictures on construction paper. Show them as you tell the Bible Adventure. Save the pictures for review in the coming weeks.

### **Bible Adventure for 2's & 3's-**

God said to Moses, "It is time to show mighty powers in Egypt. Go to Pharaoh and say, "Let My people go worship Me on the mountain." Moses obeyed God and went to the king.

*(Show the GF1 picture.)* Pharaoh said to Moses, "No, no, they can't go!" *(Chant this phrase.)*

*(Show the GF2 picture.)* Aaron stretched his staff over the water and God turned the whole river blood red. *(Color the river red.)* Wow! God has great power!

*(Show the GF1 picture again.)* God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go worship Me." Moses obeyed God and went to Pharaoh. Pharaoh said, "No, no, they can't go!"

*(Show the GF3 picture.)* Aaron stretched his staff over the river. Frogs came from out of the waters and covered the whole land. The frogs hopped into every house. They hopped in the beds and in the ovens and in the foods.

God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go worship Me." Moses obeyed God and went to Pharaoh.

*(Show the GF1 picture again.)* The Pharaoh said, "No, no, they can't go!"

*(Show the GF4 picture.)* Aaron stretched his arm out and struck the dust on the ground with his staff. Gnats crawled all over people and animals and bit their skin. *(Show the GF5 picture.)* Then God sent swarms of flies that filled all the houses and the land.

God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go worship Me.

*(Show the GF1 picture again.)* The Pharaoh said, "No, no, they can't go!"

*(Show the GF6 picture.)* The next day, all of the animals that belonged to Egyptians--the horses, donkeys, camels, cows, sheep, and goats--got sick and died, but all of the Israelites' animals were fine.

*(Show the GF7 picture.)* God said, "Go!" and Pharaoh said, "No!" so God gave all of the Egyptian people and animals sore boils on their skin.

*(Show the GF8 picture.)* God said, "Go!" and Pharaoh said, "No!" so God sent a hail and lightning storm on the Egyptians but not on the Israelites. It was the worst storm they had ever had in Egypt. God was showing the Egyptians His great power over all things.

*(Show the GF9 picture.)* God said, "Go!" and Pharaoh said, "No!" so God sent locusts, like grasshoppers, that ate every living plant in Egypt.

*(Show the GF10 picture.)* God said, "Go!" and Pharaoh said, "No!" so God sent darkness over Egypt for three days and three nights. People could not go out of their houses, it was so black.

Nine times Pharaoh said, "No" to God. God was showing the Egyptians and the Israelites that He had great power over all things. The Israelites were His people and He was their God.

**Prayer:** Dear God, You showed Your power over all things to the Egyptians and to the Israelites. You are the mighty God. Thank You, in Jesus' name, amen.

### **Bible Adventure for 4's, 5's & K-**

*(Show the GF1 picture.)* God told Moses and Aaron to go to the Pharaoh of Egypt and say, "God says, 'Let My people go worship Me on the mountain.'" Moses was afraid, but he obeyed God and went to the king.

Pharaoh heard God's words and said to Moses, "The Israelites are being lazy. They can't go. I'm going to make them work even harder than before. Now they still have to make as many bricks as before, but they must go find the straw for the bricks themselves."

*(Show the 1EXO01ECGF2 review picture.)* The Israelites were working even harder than before. They were mad at Moses for making things worse for them. They said to Moses, "You have made the Egyptians hate us even more. You have made things harder for us."

Moses said to God, "Why did You send me to Pharaoh if things only got worse for Your people?"

God said to Moses, "It is time for Me to show mighty powers and to punish the Egyptians. It is time to show the Israelites that I am their God and they are My people. I will take them back to the promised land of Canaan."

God said, "Go to Pharaoh tomorrow while he is walking by the Nile River and tell him to let the Israelites leave Egypt. If he says, 'No,' (*Show the GF1 picture again.*) then ask Aaron to stretch his staff over the water and the river will turn blood red."

Moses obeyed God, and when Pharaoh said that the Israelites could not leave Egypt, (*Show the GF2 picture.*) Aaron stretched his staff over the water and God turned the whole river into blood. (*Color the river red.*) The water turned red! The fish in the river died and it smelled so bad that the people could not drink any of the water from the river.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go worship Me. Tell him that if he refuses, I will plague the whole land of Egypt with frogs."

Moses obeyed God and went to Pharaoh. The Pharaoh's heart was hard towards God and he said, (*Chant this phrase as you fold your arms.*) "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF3 picture.*) Aaron stretched his staff over the Nile River. Frogs came from out of the waters and covered the whole land. The frogs hopped into every house. They hopped into the beds, into the ovens, and into the foods.

Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron and said, "Pray to the Lord to take the frogs away and I will let you go worship your God." So Moses prayed to God and all the frogs died. There were piles of dead frogs in the houses and in the fields. It was a mess!

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) Pharaoh hardened his heart and said to Moses, "No, no, they can't go!"

God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go. If he refuses, I will plague the whole country with gnats." Gnats are little biting bugs.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) Moses obeyed God and went to Pharaoh. Pharaoh's heart was hard and he said, "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF4 picture.*) Aaron stretched his arm out and struck the dust of the ground with his staff. Gnats crawled all over people and animals and bit their skin. (*Show the GF5 picture.*) The Pharaoh still refused and so God sent swarms of flies that filled the houses and ruined the land.

Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron and said, "Pray to the Lord to take the flies away and I will let you go worship your God." So Moses prayed and all the flies flew away.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) Pharaoh hardened his heart and said to Moses, "I have changed my mind. The Israelites cannot leave Egypt."

God said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him to let My people go worship Me. Tell him that if he refuses, I will send a disease on all of the Egyptians' horses, donkeys, camels, cows, sheep, and goats, but I will protect the Israelite animals. Then the Egyptians will know that I am the God of the Israelites."

(*Show the GF6 picture.*) The next day, all of the animals that belonged to Egyptians got sick and died, but all of the Israelites' animals were fine.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) The Pharaoh's heart was hard and he said, "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF7 picture.*) God said, "Go!" and Pharaoh said, "No!" God gave all of the Egyptian people and animals festering boils on their skin.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) Pharaoh's heart was hard and he said, "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF8 picture.*) God sent a hail and lightning storm on the Egyptians but not on the Israelites. It was the worst storm they had ever had in Egypt. God has power over all things.

(*Show the GF1 picture again.*) Did Pharaoh want to obey God? No, Pharaoh's heart was hard and he said, "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF9 picture.*) God sent locusts that ate every living plant in Egypt. Pharaoh said to Moses, "I will let the people go if you pray to your God to take away the locusts." Moses prayed, the locusts flew into the Red Sea, and, (*Show the GF1 picture again.*) foolish man, Pharaoh changed his mind again and said, "No, no, they can't go!"

(*Show the GF10 picture.*) God made darkness cover Egypt for three days and three nights. People could not go out of their houses, it was so black. They could not see their hands in front of their faces.

Nine times, Pharaoh said, "No," to God. God showed the Egyptians and the Israelites that He had power over all things. He was showing them all that the Israelites were His people and He would be their God in the land of Canaan.

Next week, we will see what happens to the Israelites in Egypt.

**Prayer:** Dear God, You showed Your power over all things to the Egyptians and to the Israelites. You are the mighty God. Thank You, in Jesus' name, amen.



## Look:

- Treasure Chest:** After the story, sing "Treasure Box," adding the new verse and a frog to the treasure chest representing the plagues God sent to Egypt.
- Aim Question Review Game:** Have the Aim Questions numbered and written on frog cutouts and hidden in the clothing of one of the leaders. When it is time to ask the questions, have one or more children look for the frogs in the pockets, cuffs, shoes, socks, or under the watch of that leader. The frogs in today's Bible Adventure somehow got into (leader's name) clothing!
- Plague of Hail:** Put a rope or line of chairs across an open space in the room with half the children on each side of the dividing line. Give the children as many soft balls or small soft animals as possible. On a signal from the teaching leader, have the children throw the balls over the chairs to "hail down upon the Egyptians." Continue to pick up the "hailstones" and throw them back to the other side of the room. When the Pharaoh refused to let God's people go, God sent a hail and lightning storm over the Egyptians but not over the Israelites, God's people.
- Memory Verse Recording:** Discuss God telling Moses that He was the Israelites' God and was going to help Moses get the Israelites free from slavery in Egypt. After practicing the memory verse several times together, ask the boys, the girls, and the teachers to say the verse. Record them saying the verse together on a tape recorder. Listen to the recording many times.
- Memory Verse Marching Band:** (Exodus 6:7) Give the children several instruments to play and have them march around the room to the open spaces while singing the memory verse song. If the instruments need to be shared, collect them after each song and redistribute them so everyone has a chance to use an instrument.
- ④ **"Flies on a Log" Snack Center:** Fill celery sticks with cream cheese and place three or more raisins along the top. In today's story, flies filled all the Egyptian houses and were on everything!
- ④ **Review:** Select children to be Moses, the Israelites, the Egyptians, and the Pharaoh. Put chairs across the corner of the room as a barrier for the Israelites who pretend to be working hard making bricks. They can't get out and Pharaoh keeps saying, "No," to Moses' requests. Let the groups chant, "Let my people go!" and, "No, no, you can't go!" Talk about what it feels like to be kept behind a barrier and not be able to get out. That is how the Israelites felt in the Bible Adventure today.
- ④ **Listening Center:** Listen to the CD filled with a variety of sounds. Let the children try to identify the sounds. Tell the children to stand up when they hear a sound that was in the Bible Adventure story today (e.g., storm with lightning and hail).
- ④ **Silly Acting Plagues and Memory Verse:** Direct the children in following you in acting out the plagues. You will have to use your imagination! Talk about how God is so powerful that he can make all these things happen. God did this to tell everyone that He was God and the Israelites were His people. End the acting by marching in place to the memory verse. River: Lay on the floor and wiggle or make waves with your hands until you see blood and your eyes get big! Frogs: Put your hands and feet on the floor and jump like a frog. Gnats: Open your fingers like star bursts all over in the air and talk about small flying things. Flies: Buzz around and make your fingers land on someone. Animals: Pretend to be a favorite animal and then fall dead. Boils: Pinch your skin all over your body. Hail: Cover your head and run undercover as if being hit by hail stones. Grasshoppers: Make small wings with your hands, crawl, jump, and make a clicking noise. Darkness: Cover eyes so you can't see anything and try to walk around.
- ④ **Feel in the Bag Review:** In a large black yard bag, place several items that remind the children of the Bible Adventure story today. Include a brick, a whip to remind of slavery, a stick like Moses used, a picture of an Egyptian Pharaoh, a bottle of red water, a flashlight to shine in the dark, a fly swatter, a box of Band-Aids, a net to catch frogs, and an umbrella for the hail. Talk about how God has power over all things, even people who disobey.
- ④ **Match the Plagues: (1EXO03ECGF12 & 1EXO03ECGF13)** Let the children take the nine GF13 plague stickers (that are in the squares) and stick them on the GF12 squares, preferably in order. Then the children can take the nine GF13 plague stickers (that are in the circles) and stick them on the GF12 circles. Color the pictures of the nine plagues. Using a different colored pencil for each

plague, have the children draw a line from the square plague to the matching circle plague. Review what happened in the Bible Adventure today.

- ④ **Musical Chairs Memory Verse Review:** When the music stops, everyone sitting on a number nine chair gets to say the memory verse together. Talk about how God had to do nine different things to the Pharaoh to prove that He was the all-powerful God of the Israelites and should be obeyed!

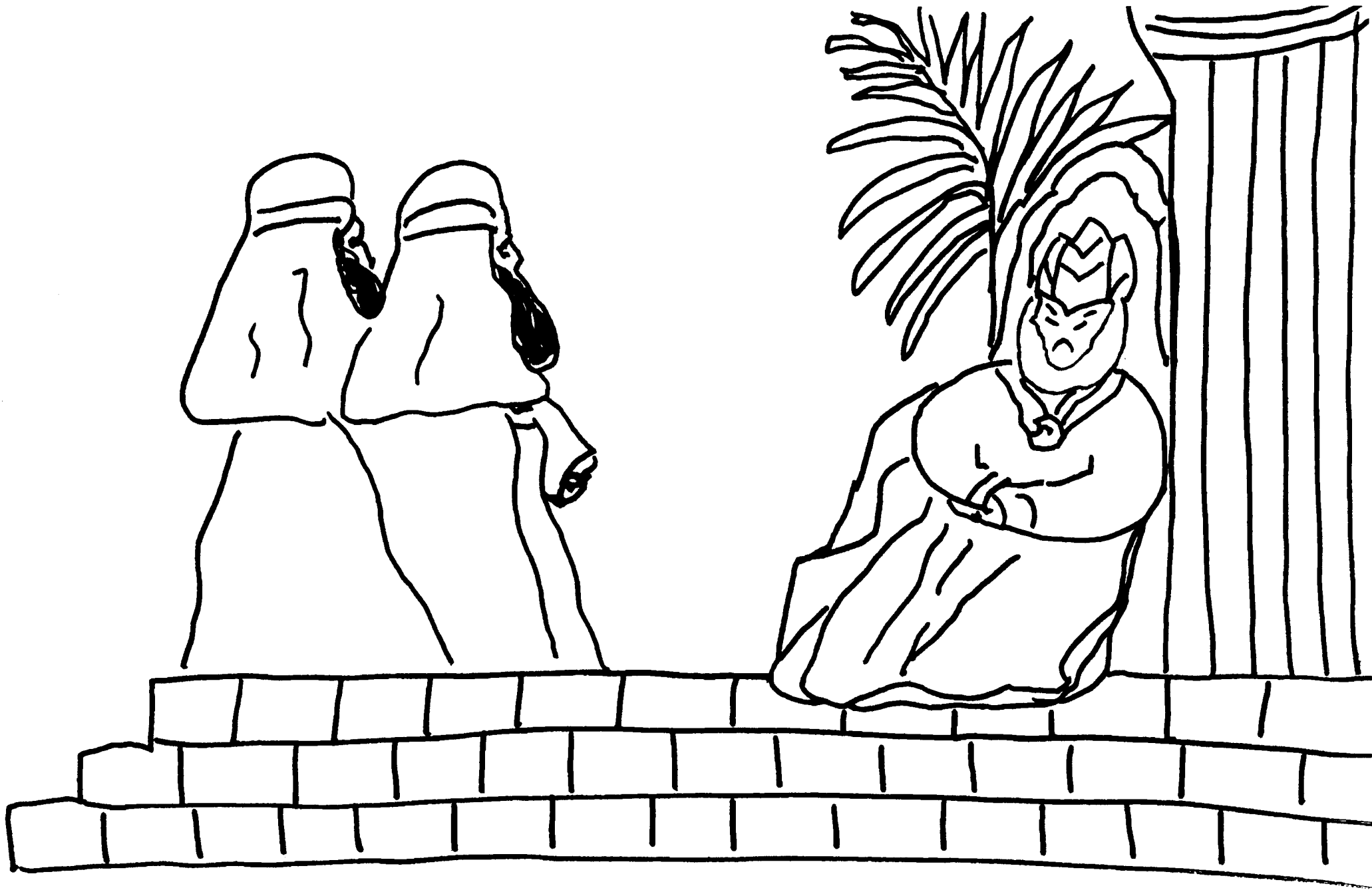

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**Took:**

- Frog Reminder: (1EXO03ECGF14)** Make a frog by gluing the circles and triangles as shown. Younger children could tear out the pieces. Glue the memory verse onto the frog's tummy and glue buttons on the eyes.
- Frog and Grasshopper Activity Sheets: (1EXO03ECGF15 & 1EXO03ECGF16)** Let the children color the pictures and glue torn leaves for the grasshoppers to eat. Talk about the Aim Questions as the children work.
- "No" Sheet: (1EXO03ECGF13 & 1EXO03ECGF17)** Print the GF13 page on 1" x 2 5/8" laser label paper. Let the children stick the GF13 plague pictures on the large NO letters. Stick the circle pictures on the "O," and the square pictures on the "N." Talk about what God had to do to Pharaoh and the Egyptians when Pharaoh said, "No," to letting the Israelites go worship God.
- ④ **Pharaoh Cards: (1EXO03ECGF18)** Cut apart the two cards on the GF18 page and fold the cards in half. Pretend that you have traveled to Egypt. Show the children where Egypt is on a map as well as some pictures of what it might have looked like when the Israelites were there. Ask the children to color the Pharaoh and draw sores on him, frogs all over the ground, flies buzzing around his head, lightning in the air, etc. Encourage the children to share their Pharaoh cards with a friend and tell them about the Bible Adventure story today.



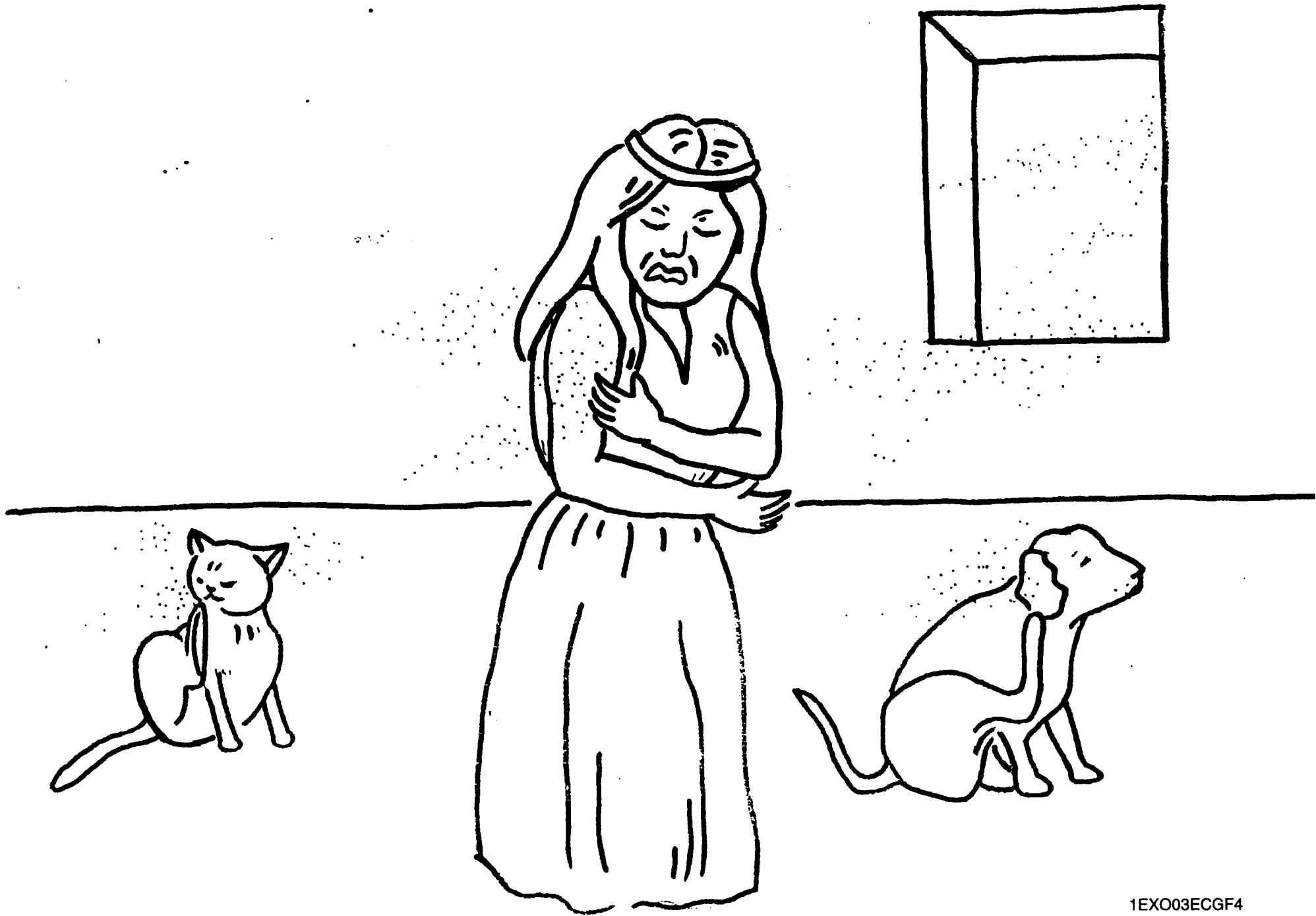
