

**Materials I Need:**

**Memory Verse:**

**Two- and three-year-old verse:** John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son."

**Four- and five-year-old verse:** John 5:24: "I tell you the truth, whoever hears My word and believes Him who sent Me has eternal life."

**Aim Questions for 2's & 3's:**

1. Did Jesus tell the royal officer that his son would get well? *(Yes, and the boy was healed.)*
2. Did Jesus make the lame man by the pool well so that he could walk? *(Yes.)*
3. Is Jesus the powerful Son of God? *(Yes.)*
4. If we hear Jesus' words and believe in Him, will we live in heaven with Jesus someday? *(Yes. Say the memory verse.)*

**Aim Questions for 4's, 5's & K:**

1. Why was the Samaritan woman shocked that Jesus would ask her for a cup of water at the well? *(Jews did not talk to Samaritan people, let alone eat and drink with them.)*
2. What did Jesus tell the Samaritan woman that made her and her friends believe that He was the Son of God? *(Jesus knew about her five husbands, He told her that He would give her living water, and He told her that He was the Christ.)*
3. In Cana, what did Jesus do for the royal official's son that made the whole family believe that Jesus was God's Son? *(Jesus told the official to go home, that his son would live, and the boy was healed.)*
4. Why did the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem get mad at Jesus for healing the man by the pool? *(Jesus told the man to carry his mat on the Sabbath, which angered the religious leaders. The Jews wanted to kill Jesus for saying that God was His Father.)*
5. How did Jesus say that we get eternal life so that we can live forever with Him in heaven? *(Say this week's memory verse. Then review last week's memory verse.)*

**Key for symbols:**

- This box symbol represents ideas that can be used for two-year-olds through kindergarten. Please remember to slow down the pace for two-year-olds and keep the pace moving for five-year-olds.
- ② This symbol represents ideas that are best used for two- and three-year-olds.
- ④ This symbol represents ideas that are best used for four-year-olds through kindergarten.

**Hook:**

- First Aid Play Center:** Provide a toy doctor's kit, ace bandages, Band-Aids, slings, crutches, etc., for the children to practice first aid on each other or on large stuffed animals. Talk about what is wrong with someone and then what they could use to help that person to get better or to help them move with that injury. In today's Bible Adventure, Jesus heals two people who could not be helped by doctors or first aid.

**Grocery Center:** Jesus asked his disciples to go to town and get some food. Let's pretend we are shopping for the food the disciples might have bought that day. Allow children to visit a pretend grocery store that you have filled with empty cans, cartons, or plastic food. They could use pretend money and paper lunch sacks.

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**Stethoscope Center:** Provide a medical stethoscope for a child to listen to his own heart and to a leader's heart. Whose heart is beating faster? Louder? Have a child jump up and down for a short time then have him listen to his heart again. Is it faster or slower than it was? In today's Bible Adventure, Jesus will be asked to go to a royal official's house to heal a little boy of his illness. The royal official believed in his own mind and heart that Jesus was the Son of God and could heal his child while doctors were unable to help.

**Blind Center:** Define the word "blind" for the children (not able to see). Set up a task for a child to perform while wearing a blindfold. He might try to pour rice from one container to another, draw a picture, eat, stack blocks, etc., while being "blind." If the children are hesitant to participate, have them watch a leader who is blindfolded try to perform tasks while the children verbally help. Jesus knew that a lot of people needed His help. They needed His help for their hearts and minds as well as for their bodies. In today's Bible Adventure, Jesus will teach that only He can make people well.

**Jesus By the Pool: (JHN03ECGF4)** Have the children color the GF4 picture while the following ideas are being discussed:

Lame--unable to walk or to walk with a limp

Blind--unable to see

Paralyzed--unable to move certain parts of the body

What would it be like to not be able to move?

Who would you ask to help you?

Would you ask Jesus to help?

Do you know anyone who has trouble walking? Who?

How could you help someone you know who can't move?

How do you think it makes Jesus feel when He sees someone who cannot move?

**Group Collage:** Find magazine pictures of a lot of different kinds of people (a mother, several children, a homeless person, etc.). As you glue these pictures to a large piece of butcher paper, discuss the following questions: Would you like to eat with \_\_\_\_, go to their house, or sit in the park and chat? Just because people look and act different from us, does that mean we can't spend time with them? God loves people of all kinds, and in today's Bible Adventure, we will hear about several different people.

**Water Bucket Play:** Place a plastic tarp on the floor and put a towel on it. Pull water out of a bucket of water. Fill different containers with water. Replace the water, and let someone else have a turn. In today's Bible Adventure, Jesus asks someone to dip into a well and give Him a drink of water.

**Dress Up Center:** Provide a lot of different hats and clothes for children to try on. Discuss them being many different people like a hobo, farmer, doctor, fireman, teacher, etc. While they are dressed up, have a teacher walk into the room to visit with all of them. Refer to this during the adventure. The teacher didn't care who they were. She/he was willing to talk to everyone no matter what they looked like or who they were.

**Puppet Talk:** Introduce two puppets that try to avoid each other. They turn their backs to each other and act stuck-up but are willing to talk to the teacher. Talk about people who aren't friendly. Being friendly is the right thing to do. What if someone always turned his back to you? What should you do? What would Jesus do? In today's Bible Adventure, we will learn that Jesus talked to a woman even though most people avoided her.

④ **Clock Center:** Prepare several clock faces on construction paper with poster board arrows and a brad paper fastener. Practice turning the hands and talking about the time of day and what is happening in the children's families at that time of the day. In the Bible Adventure, Jesus goes to a well at a certain time of day. Listen and find out what He was doing at this time of day.

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Color and mount the **JHN03ECGF1**, **JHN03ECGF2**, **JHN02ECGF3**, and **JHN02ECGF4** pictures on construction paper. Show them as you tell the Bible Adventure. Save the pictures and use them for review as you continue through the gospel of John.

Tape last week's **JHN02ECGF7** pictures of people on the large wall map as you tell about the events that happened in those places.

### **Bible Adventure for 2's & 3's-**

*(Show the review JHN01ECGF2 picture of John writing his letter.)* What was the name of the apostle who wrote the gospel of John? *(John)* What did Apostle John want us to know about Jesus? *(Jesus is the Son of God.)*

*(Show last week's JHN02ECGF4 picture.)* Last week, we heard about Nicodemus who came to Jesus at night. Jesus told Nicodemus that everyone must be born twice, the second time by believing that Jesus is the Son of God.

*(“Walk” a small picture of Jesus from Jerusalem to Cana on the large wall map. Show the review JHN02ECGF2 picture.)* Jesus left Judea and walked to Cana where His first miracle had occurred, the turning of water into wine at the wedding party. People were glad to see Jesus again.

*(“Walk” a royal official from Capernaum to Cana. Show the GF2 picture.)* While Jesus was at Cana, a royal official came to ask for Jesus' help. The officer begged Jesus, “Sir, my son is sick and dying at our home in Capernaum. Will you please come to him and make him well?”

Jesus did not need to go with the royal official. His word was powerful enough. Instead of going with the officer, Jesus said, “Go home now. Your son will live.” The man heard Jesus' words and believed Him, and started walking on his way home.

Before the officer reached home, his servant met him on the road and said, “Your son is alive. He is better!” The father was very grateful to hear the servants' words. He knew that Jesus was the powerful Son of God.

*(Show the GF3 picture.)* The father rushed home to hug his son and his wife. They all rejoiced together that the boy was well. The father told the family about Jesus' words to him. The whole family and all the servants believed in Jesus because of His powerful words that made their son well.

*(“Walk” Jesus from Cana to Jerusalem.)* When the feast of the Jews came, Jesus and His disciples walked to Jerusalem.

*(Show the GF4 picture.)* Jesus walked by a pool of water and saw all the disabled people waiting by the pool. There were blind people, lame people who couldn't walk, and people who were paralyzed and couldn't move.

Jesus said to one man who had not walked for many years, “Get up now! Pick up your mat and walk.” At once the man was healed. He picked up his mat and his legs could walk for the first time in thirty-eight years. Wow! Jesus spoke words and people were healed. Jesus really is the one and only Son of God.

**Prayer:** Dear God, thank You for Jesus, the Son of God. Thank You for His power that could heal the officer's son and the man by the pool who could not walk. Jesus is the powerful Son of God. In Jesus' name, Amen.

### **Bible Adventure for 4's, 5's & K-**

*(Show the review JHN01ECGF2 picture of John writing his letter.)* What was the name of the apostle who wrote the gospel of John? *(John)* What did the Apostle John want us to know about Jesus? *(Jesus is the one and only Son of God.)*

*(Show last week's JHN02ECGF1 map of Israel. Put Jesus and His disciples by the Jordan River.)* More and more people were coming to listen to Jesus and being baptized. The Jewish leaders in Jerusalem were jealous of the attention Jesus was receiving, so He decided it was time to go north to Galilee for awhile.

*(“Walk” a small picture of Jesus from Jerusalem toward Samaria on the large wall map.)* Normally, when Jewish people walked to Galilee from Judea, they went around Samaria on the east side of the Jordan River because the Jews would not talk to Samaritan people. The Samaritans didn't obey the Jewish law and worshipped on Mount Gerizim rather than going to Jerusalem as God had commanded.

Jews would never eat or drink with Samaritans, nor go into their homes. That's why it was very strange what Jesus, a Jewish man, did when He came to the town of Sychar in the region of Samaria. *(Have the children say, “Samaria,” several times.)*

(*Show the GF1 picture.*) Jesus was tired when He reached Samaria and sat down by a well of water. Jesus sent His disciples into town for food. While the disciples were gone, a Samaritan woman came to the well to draw water for her family to drink.

Jesus spoke to the Samaritan woman and said, "Will you give me a drink?"

The woman was shocked and said, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?"

Jesus didn't care about social customs. He cared about people knowing who He was, the Son of God. Jesus said, "If you knew who I was, you would have asked me for living water."

The woman didn't understand what Jesus was saying. She said, "How can you give me living water? You have nothing to put water in."

Jesus said, "Everyone who drinks water from this well will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the 'living water' that I give will never thirst. The water I give is living water that brings eternal life."

The woman said, "Give me Your water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming to the well."

Jesus said, "Go, call your husband and come back."

The Samaritan woman said, "I don't have a husband."

Jesus said, "You tell the truth. You have had five husbands and the man you are now living with is not your husband."

The woman was shocked that Jesus knew everything about her. She said, "Are you a prophet? I know the Christ is coming. When He comes, He will explain everything to us."

Jesus said very clearly, "I am the Christ who is to come."

Just then the disciples returned with food. They were surprised to find Jesus talking to a woman. The Samaritan woman left her water jar and hurried back to town to tell everyone what had happened. She said to her friends, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could He be the Christ?" Many Samaritans were curious and went to see Jesus.

The Samaritans asked Jesus to stay in Samaria so that they could learn more about Him. Jesus stayed two days and many listened to Jesus' words and believed in Him. They said, "We believe that Jesus is the Savior of the world, the Son of God who gives eternal life." They were glad that eternal life was not only for Jewish people; it was also for Samaritans. Jesus' words are for everyone from every nation who will hear and believe.

(*"Walk" Jesus from Sychar to Cana.*) Jesus left Samaria and walked to Cana where His first miracle had occurred, the turning of water into wine at the wedding party. People were glad to see Jesus again.

(*"Walk" the JHN02ECGF7 picture of the royal official from Capernaum to Cana on the large wall map. Show this week's GF2 picture.*) A royal official came from Capernaum to Cana to ask for Jesus' help. The officer begged Jesus, "Sir, my son is dying in Capernaum. Will you please come to him and make him well?"

Jesus said to the royal official, "Go home now. Your son will live." The man heard Jesus' words, believed Him, and went on his way home.

Before the officer reached his home, his servant met him on the road and said, "Your son is alive. He is better!" The father was very grateful to hear the servants' words. He said, "What time did my son start getting better?"

The servants said, "The fever left him yesterday at 1:00 PM." Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live."

(*Show the GF3 picture.*) The royal official rushed home to hug his son and his wife. They all believed that Jesus was the one and only Son of God because of His powerful words that made the boy well.

(*"Walk" Jesus from Cana to Jerusalem on the large map.*) When the feast of the Jews came, Jesus and His disciples walked to Jerusalem.

(*Show the GF4 picture.*) Jesus walked by a pool of water called Bethesda and saw all the disabled people waiting by the pool. There were blind people, lame people who couldn't walk, and people who were paralyzed and couldn't move.

Jesus said to one man, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." At once the man was healed. He picked up his mat, and his legs could walk for the first time in thirty-eight years. Wow! Jesus spoke words and people were healed. Jesus' words were powerful.

The Jews saw the man carrying his mat, and instead of being happy for him, they said, "You can't carry a mat on the Sabbath. You're breaking the law."

The man said, "The man who healed me told me to take up my mat and walk. I am doing what He told me to do."

The Jews said, "Who was the man who healed you?" The man said, "I don't know who He was."

When the Jews found out that it was Jesus who healed the man on the Sabbath, they were angry with Jesus and wanted to kill Him. They were especially angry that Jesus was telling people that God

was His Father, making Himself equal with God. They didn't want to believe like the Samaritans, who heard Jesus' words and believed in Him. They didn't want to believe, like the royal official whose son was healed. The Jewish leaders in Jerusalem wanted to persecute Jesus and hurt Him.

Next week, we will hear more of Jesus' miracles that He did to prove that He is the one and only Son of God.

**Prayer:** Dear God, thank You for Jesus, the Son of God. Thank You for His power that could heal the officer's son and the man by the pool who could not walk. Thank You that He loves all kinds of people, the Samaritans as well as the Jews. He loves me, too. In Jesus' name, Amen.



### Look:



**Aim Questions:** One of the helpers would be dressed up before the Bible Adventure as an injured person by wearing a sling, ace bandage, Band-Aid, and/or gauze wrap. The numbered questions would be tucked into the various healing aids. The children would be called up one at a time to find the next question to be read.



**Snack Discussion:** In today's Bible Adventure, Jesus healed two or three people of things that were wrong with them. They were so thankful that they told others that it was Jesus who had healed them. During snack time, try to have the children state one-line thoughts about why they are thankful for what God does in their lives. The following are only suggestions. We are thankful because. . .

We have good parents.

We have nice teachers.

We have good friends.

We have good healthy food.

God gave us pretty flowers.

We have warm homes.

We have legs that walk.

We live in a good country.



**"Jesus Healed with Powerful Words" Booklet: (JHN03ECGF6)** Copy a GF6 page for each child. Fold the page in fourths so that the first page is at the front of the booklet. As the children color their pictures, talk about what happened in the Bible Adventure. Two- and three-year-olds will not have heard the story of the Samaritan woman, so emphasize the other two pictures. Sing songs (see the Song section) that reinforce the main point of the lesson, that Jesus' powerful words healed because He is the Son of God.



**Visitor in a Wheelchair:** Invite someone who uses a wheelchair to visit the classroom to talk about not being able to walk. Have them explain or demonstrate how the wheelchair works to help them get around. Allow the children to ask questions. End the discussion with the conclusion that only Jesus, the Son of God, can heal people.



**"Thankful for Everything" Finger Play:**

Thank you, God, for my family.

*(Hold up fingers to represent your family members.)*

Thank you, God, for friends I see.

*(Shade your eyes with your hand.)*

Thank you, God, for birds that sing.

*(Flap your arms.)*

Thank you, God, for Jesus, our King!

*(Make a crown over your head with your hands.)*

Thank you, God, for butterflies and flowers.

*(Smell a flower.)*

Thank you, God, for sunshine and showers.

*(Wiggle your fingers downward.)*

Hear all my prayers and let me say,

*(Fold your hands in a prayer position.)*

I'm a thankful child on this very day!



**4 Drama: Jesus Heals the Officer's Son:** Characters needed: Narrator (reads the story and prompts the actors), Jesus (in a robe), disciples (twelve or less), a royal official (with a fancy sash), a wife (with a head covering), the officer's family on the opposite side of the room from Jesus, a sick child (lying on the floor), a servant, and the audience (sitting on the floor facing the actors). Ask for volunteers to do the acting parts and then go through the story once or twice with them before presenting it to the rest of the class. Those children not in the play could be coloring or working with puzzles.

"Jesus walked with His disciples from Judea to Cana. *(Jesus and the disciples walk from one part of the room to where the audience is sitting.)* The people at Cana were glad to see Jesus again.

*(Audience claps and cheers.)* They remembered that Jesus had turned water into wine at their

friends' wedding. *(The disciples walk over and sit in front of the audience and Jesus pretends to speak to the crowd.)* While Jesus was teaching, a royal officer came from another city to ask for Jesus' help. *(Royal officer leaves area of family, approaches Jesus, and gets down on his knees.)* The officer begs Jesus to heal his son who is very sick and dying back at his home. The officer wanted Jesus to go home with him and make his son well. *(Officer points to his home and folds his hands in a begging position.)* But Jesus would not go. *(Jesus shakes His head, "No.")* He said instead, 'Go home now. Your son will live.' *(Jesus points to officer's family.)* The officer believed Jesus and got up to go home. *(Officer stands and walks toward his family on the other side of the room.)* Before the officer was even home, his servant ran out to tell him that his son was better. *(Servant runs to officer excitedly.)* The father was very happy to hear the servant's words. *(Father claps and then hugs the servant.)* The father then knew that Jesus was the powerful Son of God. He ran home to hug his son and wife and told them about Jesus. *(Father hugs his wife and son and points to where Jesus is standing.)* The officer's family and his servant believed in Jesus because of His powerful words that made their little boy well." *(Everyone kneels in praying position. Applause.)*

**"Hear, Believe, and Receive" Review Chant:**

Hear! Clap, clap, clap. *(Hold hands to ears.)*  
 Believe! Clap, clap, clap. *(Point to your heart.)*  
 Receive eternal life! Stomp, stomp. *(Point upwards.)*  
 Hear, believe, receive! *(Clap and stomp for each word.)*

Discuss how the woman at the well heard the truth about who Jesus was, believed, and received eternal life. Then she went and told others about Jesus so that they could know Him, too.

- ④ **Feel-in-the-Bag: (JHN03ECGF1)** Place several items in a bag, including a small pillow (Who was tired?), a water bottle (Who asked for a drink?), a toy car (Did Jesus travel by car to Samaria?), plastic food (Who went to get food?), the GF1 picture of the woman and Jesus (What did Jesus tell this woman at the well?), a doll wrapped up and holding a thermometer (What did Jesus do for the dying son?), a hat for royalty (What did the royal official ask Jesus to do?), a clock or watch set at one o'clock (What time did Jesus visit the well?), a doll with its leg wrapped (What did Jesus do for the lame man?), a calendar with Saturday circled (What did Jesus do on the Sabbath that made some people mad?), and anything else you can think of!
- ④ **Prayer Center:** Pray for people in different countries that are different from us. Show pictures of different nationalities. Pray that they would understand that Jesus is God and if they receive Him they can live with Him forever in heaven.
- ④ **Duck, Duck, Goose:** Play this game using the words "good day, good day, pick up your mat and walk." If rug mats are available, give one to each child to sit on.
- ④ **Snack:** Serve pretzels and when a child asks for water, discuss the living water that Jesus gives which changes us from the inside, in our souls, so that we desire to please Jesus, live like He lived, and receive His eternal life.
- ④ **Memory Verse & Aim Question Review:** Place the Aim Questions in a bucket that you pull out of another larger bucket as if it were the well. Include papers with the verse. When they are pulled up, all the children say the verse together.

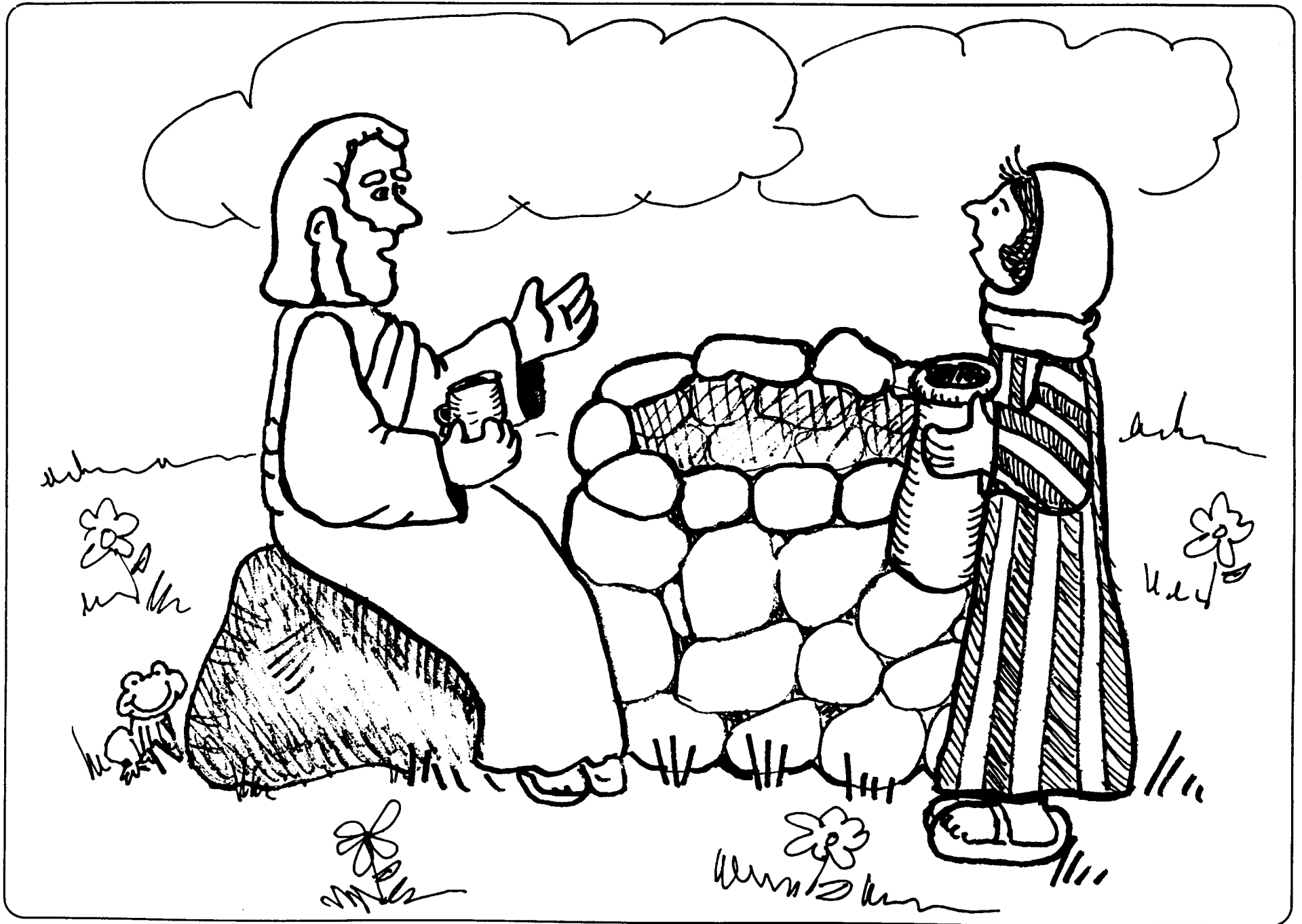
### Took:

**Megaphone Review:** Jesus' words are for everyone to hear. People need to hear with their ears so that they can believe with their hearts. Jesus talked to all kinds of people and told them who He was. We can tell everyone about Jesus. "Come meet Jesus. He is God's Son. He knows everything. He gives eternal life." Let the children make megaphones by curling paper to make a cone shape. Tape the edges. (Toilet paper tubes would work well.) Glue the memory verse on the megaphone. Use a megaphone to talk to a farmer, a doctor, a fireman, etc. You might use the hats again (in the hat bin) and practice talking to several people about Jesus. Go to an outside door, open it, and say the memory verse together as you share it with anyone who might be listening!

**Flap Picture Book: (JHN03ECGF5, JHN03ECGF7, and JHN03ECGF8)** Color the three GF7 Bible Adventure pictures. Cut them apart and staple the tops of the pictures at the staple marks on the GF5 page. Staple a 4" x 4" piece of colored paper over the top of the pictures, so that the cover flap can be lifted to see the pictures beneath. Poke holes as shown and reinforce them. Tie a piece of yarn looped through both holes. Tape a GF8 picture of Jesus onto the yarn and move Him toward the pictures. Lift up the cover flap to see the review picture below. Lift each picture flap and discuss what Jesus said to each person.  
Samaritan woman at the well -- "I am the Son of God. I give living water and bring eternal life."

**Bible Adventure Review Stickers: (JHN03ECGF7)** Copy the GF7 page onto 3 1/3" x 4" laser labels to make stickers for the children. Otherwise, simply copy the page on regular paper, cut apart the pictures, and let the children glue the pictures to any colored construction paper. Review the meaning of the pictures as the children work. These stickers can be used in a variety of ways. The teacher could ask the children with the woman at the well pictures to put them on a large piece of butcher paper that is taped to the wall. Then the children with the royal official's healed son could stick their pictures to the butcher paper. Lastly, those with the pictures of the lame man could put their stickers on the paper. Say, "Jesus is the Son of God," as the children put their stickers on the paper. Sing appropriate verses to songs found in the Song section.

 **Preschool Page for Parents: (JHN03ECPPP)** Send a page home with each child, encouraging parents to take advantage of the reinforcement of Bible truths that can happen at home. Spend a few minutes before the children go home creatively reviewing the song and memory verse.
