**Materials I Need:**

**Memory Verse:**

**Be strong and courageous. . . God will be with you wherever you go. Joshua 1:9**

**Attribute of God emphasized in the book of Joshua: God is all-powerful.**

**Aim Questions for 2's & 3's:**

1. **Did the Israelite men obey God and march around the Jericho walls?** *(Yes. One, two, three, four, five, six, seven. The men marched around Jericho each day for seven days.)*
2. **Did the Levite priests blow their trumpets as they marched around Jericho?** *(Yes. The priests obeyed God.)*
3. **Were the Israelite men quiet as they marched around Jericho?** *(Yes. They obeyed God and did not say anything as they marched around Jericho together.)*
4. **Did the walls of Jericho fall down when the Israelites shouted?** *(Yes. The walls came tumbling down.)*
5. **Were the Israelites strong and courageous?** *(Yes. Say the memory verse.)*

**Aim Questions for 4's, 5's & K:**

1. **What did God tell Joshua to do to take over the city of Jericho?** *(God told the Israelites to march around Jericho each day for six days with seven priests blowing trumpets in front of the Ark. On the seventh day, they were told to march around the city seven times and then give a shout.)*
2. **What happened to Jericho when the Israelites obeyed God?** *(The Jericho walls came tumbling down and the Israelites captured the city.)*
3. **What happened when Achan disobeyed God and stole the robe, the silver, and the gold?** *(When Achan coveted and stole the items that belonged to the Lord, the Israelites did not win the battle at Ai.)*
4. **What happened after Achan was punished?** *(When Joshua obeyed God and punished Achan, God was with the Israelites again and gave them the town of Ai.)*
5. **What happens when you and I covet and steal something that doesn't belong to us?** *(God punishes us.)*
6. **What happens when we obey God?** *(Say the memory verse.)*

**Key for symbols:**

- This box symbol represents ideas that can be used for two-year-olds through kindergarten. Please remember to slow down the pace for two-year-olds and keep the pace moving for five-year-olds.
- ② This symbol represents ideas that are best used for two- and three-year-olds.
- ④ This symbol represents ideas that are best used for four-year-olds through kindergarten.

**Hook:**

- Jewelry Center:** Bring some bracelets, necklaces, crowns, or anything else that would be eye-catching to the children. Allow them to play with these items. Talk about how it would feel to have

such things for themselves and ask what they would do if they knew they weren't supposed to keep them after they found them. In today's Bible Adventure, Joshua tells the people they are not to keep the pretty things they find in Jericho but are to put them into the Lord's treasury.

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- Plastic Trumpets:** Use plastic orange juice or milk jugs. Cut out the wide bottom. Wrap strong mailing or duct tape over the cut edge. Hold the handles and blow out of the spouts. These trumpets will be used during the Look time.
- ② **Jericho Building Blocks Center:** Use large blocks or small boxes to construct walls so the children can step into the protection of the encircling walls of the "city of Jericho." After everyone is out of "Jericho," have the children knock the walls down. In today's Bible Adventure, the city of Jericho was built with thick stone walls around it for protection from armies.
- ② **Horn Blowing Center:** Bring a variety of toy horns to class for the children to practice blowing on. Try blowing and marching at the same time. Wash the mouthpieces between each blower. In today's Bible Adventure, seven priests will be doing a lot of horn blowing!
- ④ **Counting Days:** Let children count the days in a week on a calendar. Let them place one bean or Cheerio on six of the days and seven on the seventh day.
- ④ **Building Block Walls:** Use blocks you might have or make your own out of half gallon milk cartons, stuffed with paper and taped shut to make them firm. While the walls are up, discuss how you might attack a city that is inside the walls. What would you tell your men to do to go in and take control? God had a plan to take Jericho, and if the Israelites obeyed God's Word, they would see God's great power give them victory.
- ④ **Play Dough Jericho:** Make the walls out of play dough and discuss what action you might take to get inside the walls. "I wonder if your plan is like God's plan. Listen to the Bible Adventure and find out."
- ④ **Relay Game:** Divide children into two teams. Pick an item that relates to the Bible Adventure story like a cardboard building block, a small flat stone, or a piece of silver and ask a child to balance it "waiter-style" on a paper plate or on top of her head. The challenge is to walk with it to the other side of the room and back before handing it to the next person in line on the team. If it drops, the child can pick it up and continue.
- ④ **Mystery Container:** Using an empty cylindrical oatmeal container, place a piece of gold, a silver spoon, and a piece of clothing for the robe inside of it. Pull an old tube sock over the open end and place a rubber band around it if it is not tight enough. The children can take turns placing their hand in the sock and feeling inside. They are to guess what they are feeling. Tell them to listen for these items in the Bible Adventure today.



### **Book:**

#### **Presentation Ideas -**

- Color and mount the 1JOS02ECGF1, 1JOS02ECGF2, 1JOS02ECGF3, 1JOS02ECGF4, and 1JOS02ECGF5 pictures on construction paper. Show them as you tell the Bible Adventure. Save them for review as you go through the book of Joshua.
- Continue using "Be strong" (*Flex your muscles.*) and "courageous" (*Cross your arms over your heart.*) actions as you teach the Bible Adventure and refer to the memory verse.
- The Bible Adventure for preschoolers does not mention the fact that God is not only gifting Israel with the land of Canaan, beginning with the city of Jericho, but He is also judging the people of Canaan for its wickedness. The Canaanites fully deserved the punishment that came through the Israelites. See Deuteronomy 9:4-6.

#### **Bible Adventure for 2's & 3's-**

(Show last week's 1JOS01ECGF1 picture of Joshua looking across the Jordan River at the walled city of Jericho.) The city of Jericho was on a hill and had thick stone walls around it. There were soldiers on top of the walls, guarding the city so that the Israelites could not get in. The Jericho gates were shut tight so that no one could go in or out.

God said to Joshua, "You will get into the city if you do what I tell you. (*Show the GF1 and GF2 pictures side by side.*) March around Jericho for six days. March with the ark and seven priests in front of the ark. (*Count to six, then say, "March, march, march."*)

"Have the priests blow their trumpets as they march. In front of the priests and behind them, have the armed soldiers march with their swords, but don't let them say a word. (*Put your finger to your mouth as though asking for silence.*) Have them quietly march, around and around, once around the city each day for six days. March, march, march. Shh, shh, shh. Toot, toot, toot."

(*Count to seven.*) "On the seventh day, have the men march around the city seven times with the priests blowing their trumpets. Then have the people shout at the top of their lungs."

Joshua said to the people, "When God takes us into the city, if you see anything in the houses that you want, don't covet it and take it. The gold, the silver, and all the valuable things in Jericho belong to the Lord."

Joshua and the men obeyed God. (*Hold up six fingers and count to six.*) One, two, three, four, five, six days the Israelite men marched around the city with the priests blowing their trumpets. (*Have the children say, "Toot, toot, toot," with you.*) It was hot, but God promised to be with them, and God is all-powerful. The Israelites didn't say a word. They just obeyed God and kept walking.

On the seventh day, the Israelites marched again. (*Hold up seven fingers, one at a time.*) One, two, three, four, five, six, seven times the Israelites marched around the city.

(*Show the GF3 picture of men shouting and the wall falling down.*) When Joshua gave the signal, the priests blew their horns. When the priests blew their horns, the Israelites all shouted at the top of their lungs. When the Israelites obeyed God and shouted, the city walls all came tumbling down. Crash! Boom! Kerplow!

What a powerful God! The Israelites rushed into the city and captured it. The Israelites were thankful that God was with them.

(*Show the GF5 picture.*) Joshua took the Israelites up the sides of two mountains. Half of the people went up one mountain and half went up the other mountain. The Israelites could see each other and hear each other. In between the mountains, priests stood with the ark.

Joshua was thankful that God was with them and built an altar to the Lord on Mount Ebal. There on the mountain, Joshua wrote on stones the law that Moses had written down. Joshua read all the words of the law out loud to the Israelite families. The dads, the moms, and the children all listened to God's words so that they could learn to obey.

**Prayer:** Dear God, You are all-powerful and made the walls of Jericho fall down. I want to obey like Joshua and listen to Your words. In Jesus' name, Amen.

### **Bible Adventure for 4's, 5's & K-**

(*Show last week's 1JOS01ECGF1 picture of Joshua looking across the Jordan River at the walled city of Jericho.*) The city of Jericho was on a hill and had thick stone walls around it. There were soldiers on top of the walls, guarding the city so that the Israelites could not get in. The Jericho gates were shut tight with all of its people inside. The people of Jericho thought that no Israelite could get inside the city.

God said to Joshua, "I have already given you the city of Jericho. Now this is what I want you to do. (*Show the GF1 and GF2 pictures, side by side.*) Each day for six days, I want seven priests to march in front of the ark around the city. Have the priests blow their trumpets as they march. In front of the priests and behind them, have the armed soldiers march with their swords, but don't let them say a word. Have them quietly march, around and around, once around the city each day for six days.

"On the seventh day, have the men march around the city seven times with the priests blowing their trumpets. When they have walked around the city seven times, have the people all shout at the top of their lungs."

(*Show last week's 1JOS01ECGF2 picture of Rahab.*) Joshua told the Israelites about God's plan for Jericho. He said, "When we take the city, go to Rahab's house, the one with the red cord hanging from the window, and bring her family out safely to us. She hid our spies and wants to worship God with us.

"When God lets us into the city, don't keep any of the Jericho gold or silver for yourselves. If you see anything in the city that you want, don't covet it and take it. The gold, the silver, and all the valuable things in Jericho belong to the Lord."

Joshua and the men obeyed God. (*Hold up six fingers, one at a time.*) One, two, three, four, five, six days the Israelite men marched around the city with the priests blowing their trumpets. It was hot, and it was embarrassing when the soldiers of Jericho looked at them over the city wall.

"You will never take our city by walking around, blowing trumpets," they shouted. "Ha, ha, ha!" they laughed.

“God promised to be with us, and God is all-powerful,” the Israelites were thinking, but they didn’t say a word. They just obeyed God and kept walking.

On the seventh day, the Israelites marched again. (*Hold up seven fingers, one at a time.*) One, two, three, four, five, six, seven times the Israelites marched around the city. The moment came when God would do a powerful miracle.

(*Show the GF3 picture.*) When Joshua gave the signal, the priests blew their horns. When the priests blew their horns, the Israelites all shouted at the top of their lungs. When the Israelites obeyed God and shouted, the city walls all came tumbling down. Crash! Boom! Kerplop!

The Israelites rushed into the city and captured it. God gave the victory! The Israelites were glad that the all-powerful God had kept His promise to be with them.

The two Israelite spies went to Rahab’s house and brought her family out safely. Then the men continued looking in all of the houses to find gold, silver, and anything valuable to put in the Lord’s treasury.

(*Show the GF4 picture.*) One man named Achan did not obey God. When he saw a beautiful robe, some silver, and a block of gold in one of the Jericho houses, he coveted it for himself. Coveting means wanting something that does not belong to you. Achan knew that the silver and gold in Jericho belonged to God and that no Israelite should keep any for himself, but Achan coveted and stole the robe, the silver, and the gold anyway. Achan dug a hole under his tent and hid the robe, the silver, and the gold in the hole.

After the Israelites burned down the city of Jericho, they chose the town of Ai as their next place to capture. Ai was a small town compared to Jericho, and the Israelites were sure that it would be easy to take the town quickly.

When Joshua sent Israelite men to capture the town of Ai, the Israelites did not win the battle. God was not with them and did not give them victory.

Joshua was shocked. What had happened? Joshua and the Israelite elders tore their clothes and fell facedown to the ground before the Ark of the Lord. Joshua lay with his face to the ground all day. He was very upset.

Joshua said, “Lord, why didn’t you give us the town of Ai? What will people think of Your power now? They will think that You are not with us.”

The Lord said, “Stand up, Joshua. The reason I did not help you win at Ai is because Israel has sinned. Achan has disobeyed and I will not be with you anymore until you punish him.”

Joshua called for Achan and said, “Tell me what you have done; don’t hide it from me.”

Achan confessed and said, “It is true. I have sinned against the Lord. When I saw the beautiful robe, the gold, and the silver, I coveted them and took them. I hid them in the ground inside my tent.”

Joshua brought Achan and his whole family out and punished them severely. It was a terrible thing for all of Israel when even one man chose to disobey the Lord. Achan’s coveting and stealing hurt not only himself, but his family, and all of Israel. Disobeying always hurts many people.

After Achan was punished, the Lord said to Joshua, “Be strong and courageous. Now you can go take the city of Ai. I will be with you and will give you victory.”


(*Show the GF5 picture.*) Joshua took the Israelites up the sides of two mountains. Half of the people went up Mount Ebal and the other half went up Mount Gerizim. The Israelites could see each other and hear each other. In between the mountains, priests stood with the ark.

Joshua was thankful that God was with them and built an altar to the Lord on Mount Ebal. There on the mountain, Joshua wrote on stones the law that Moses had written down. Joshua read all the words of the law out loud to the Israelite families. The dads, the moms, and the children all listened to God’s words so that they could learn to obey.

**Prayer:** Dear God, You gave victory to the Israelites and made the walls of Jericho fall down. You punish those who disobey. I want to obey like Joshua, not disobey like Achan. Help me obey, in Jesus’ name, Amen.



### Look:

 **Burning Jericho Activity Page: (1JOS03ECGF3)** After the children color the GF3 picture, they can glue bits of orange construction paper to the tumbling Jericho walls. The Israelites obeyed God and burned the city of Jericho after the walls fell down. God was punishing the wicked people of Jericho for their years of disobedience. Talk about God’s mighty power as the children work. Talk about the kind of courage it would take for Joshua and the Israelites to obey and walk around the city rather

than trying to climb over the walls or battering the gates down. God's ways are not our ways. It takes courage to do things God's way. Sing the memory verse song.

**Aim Questions:** Tape the questions to five or six building blocks and pile them up in numerical order. Ask the first child to take the top block off, untape the question, and leave the block on the floor while the leader reads the question. When all the questions have been asked, the "wall" will be gone.

**Memory Verse Review:** Using trumpets the children helped you make during the Hook time, ask the teams of children (standing opposite each other) to shout the verse through the trumpets back and forth.

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**The Ark:** Materials needed: a small Chinese takeout food carton and two plastic straws for each child and some gold paint with brushes (or gold foil). Have the children put the straws under the lid of the container and separate them before closing the top and taping it shut to hold the straws apart. Paint the "arks" gold with the paint and brushes, or cover the box with gold foil. Talk about how God asked the priests to carry the ark around Jericho for seven days. Talk about the Aim Questions as the children work. Let the children pretend to be priests and carry their arks by the straws around the room (Jericho). Sing one or more of the songs as the children carry their arks.

**Walking on the Wall:** Place several two-by-fours or two-by-sixes on their sides on the floor and let children practice walking on top of them and not stepping off but pretending it is a high wall. Walk around with trumpets also.

**Snack:** Give each child a sandwich bag full of miniature marshmallows. Let the children build their own walls on a line on a paper towel. Talk about God giving the Israelites the victory because they obeyed His words. Older children can talk about situations they are facing and what God would want them to do. Examples would be not taking something that isn't theirs, not lying, not saying unkind words at home, and obeying at home.

**Marching Around Jericho:** Pile some boxes or blocks in the center of an open area to represent the city of Jericho. The people of Jericho were wicked people and did not love God. God wanted the Israelites to worship Him in the Promised Land of Canaan so God gave the Israelites victory over the city of Jericho.

- ④ **Aim Questions and Marching:** Let children tear brown paper bag stones to place on the floor in a circle. Tape them down well. Place numbers on them for the questions. When the march music stops, the child on number “1” gets to answer that question, etc. Practice marching around them quietly, loudly, tip-toeing, sliding, stepping high, making long steps, quick steps, and skipping.
- ④ **Stepping Stones:** Divide children into pairs. Together they stand on a brown paper bag stone from the above activity. When you instruct them to go, they hop together to the next stone, keeping all their feet on the stone. Hop all the way around the circle. Change partners and go in a different direction to add variety. This could be a “Hook” activity also.
- ④ **Bible Adventure Review:** Pretend to be a news reporter and interview several of the other teachers who pretend to have been there when the Israelites marched around the wall. Ask them to share what they saw or what they experienced as a military marcher or a citizen of Jericho.
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- ④ **Human Wall:** Let children build a wall with their bodies by linking arms, standing strong, huddled together, etc. Ask two children to volunteer to try to topple the wall over. Talk about how God helped Joshua because he obeyed. It would have been impossible without God’s help.
- ④ **“Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes” Large Muscle Activity:**  
I want to obey God, head, shoulders, knees and toes, ankles, legs, neck ,and nose.

**Took:**

 **Joshua Mask: (1JOS02ECGF7)** Have each child make a Joshua mask and put it on to retell the Bible Adventure to his family. Go over the story simply with the children while wearing one of the masks. Each child needs a paper plate with holes cut out for eyes. Draw a smile and a nose with a marker. Let the children glue the memory verse on the mask. Cut strips of brown construction paper to glue on for hair and a beard. Punch holes on each side and tie an eight-to-ten-inch piece of yarn to each hole. Tie the mask on the child so he can act out the story. Let each "Joshua" say the memory verse to a teacher after the whole group has reviewed the verse together.

 **"I Want to Obey God" Bracelet: (1JOS02ECGF8)** Make a bracelet out of a two-inch piece of toilet paper roll. Cut once vertically through the roll so that the child can put it on his wrist. Put a Bible sticker on it and glue on the words, "I want to obey God." Ask children to share with others how Joshua obeyed God and how God gave him victory at Jericho.

④ **"Don't Be Like Achan" Discussion Page: (1JOS02ECGF6)** Use the GF6 page to talk with the children about the sins of coveting, stealing, and lying. Talk about seeing things they want and the choices they must make if they want to obey God and not hurt a lot of people. Achan was punished severely for disobeying God. God always knows what we are thinking and doing. He knows what is best for us and gives us what is best.

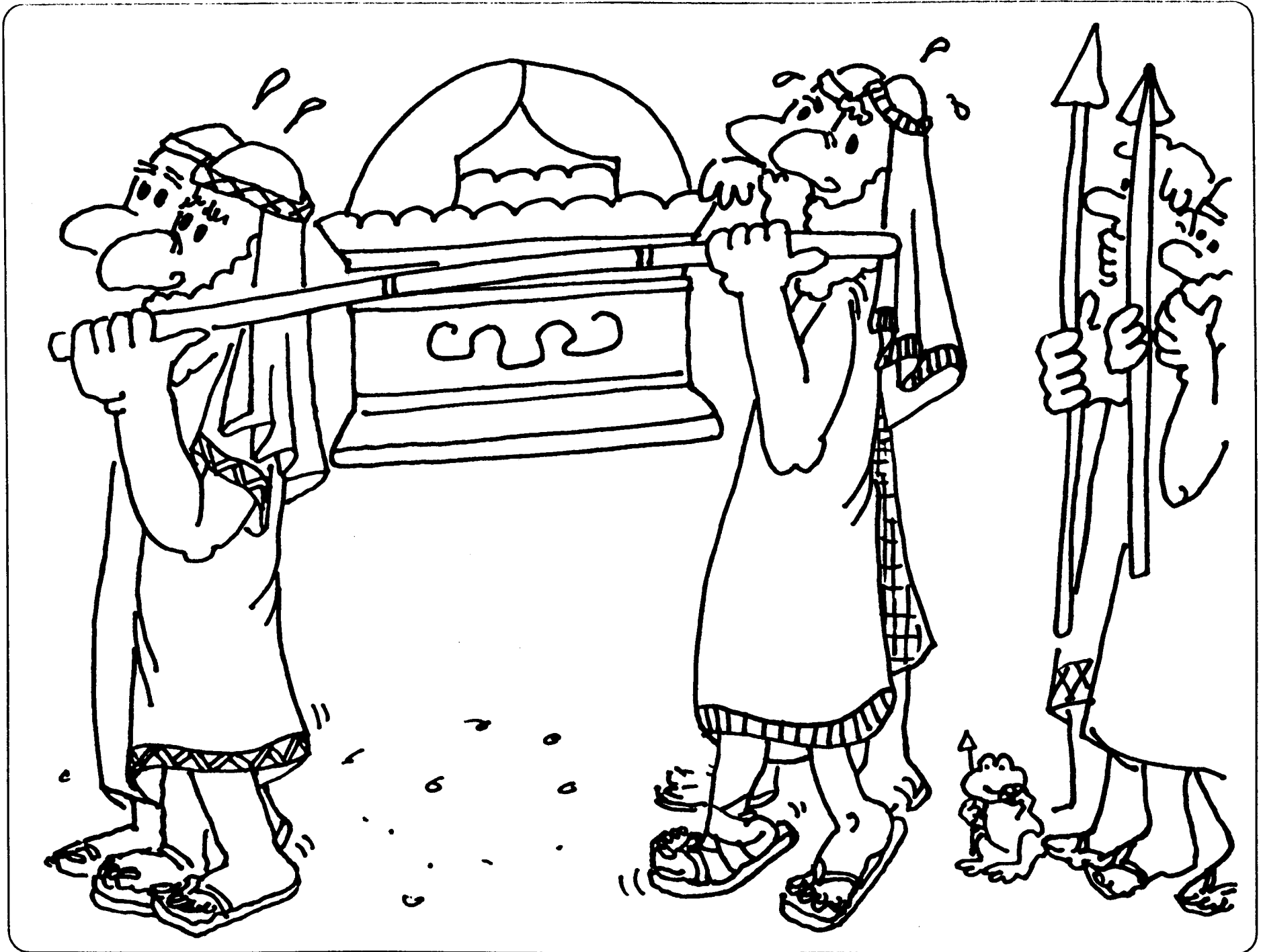
④ **Stone Hunt & Sharing:** Walk outside and find one special stone for each child. As you gather around in a circle on the grass, let the teachers lead in sharing something they want to do to obey God so that God's power will give them victory. Ask the children if they can share a way they can obey God. You might share a way that God has helped you like He helped the Israelites have victory in Jericho.

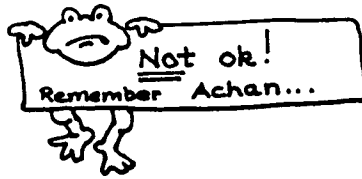
