Illustration/Overheads for Lessons 1-24. Place in chronological order, and have students retell the story depicted by the pictures. Be prepared to fill in the events between the illustrations to provide the students with a thorough review of the book of Luke. *Teachers: This is a good time to evaluate your teaching methods and what worked best for your group of students.*



Review:



Luke Review (Review Sheet). Use the review sheet located in Lesson Book #1 (*Lessons 1-6*).



Journey With Jesus (Journal). Read through your journals as a class, in hand-off style. Call on one student volunteer to read their first entry, another to read their second, and so on.



Miracles and Parables (Review Game). Divide the class into two teams. Cut and separate Miracle cards from **BLUK22.GF1 Pg. 1** and Parable cards from **BLUK22.GF1 Pg. 2**. Teams will take turns as challengers. The challenging team will draw a “miracle” or a “parable” card (*their choice of category*) and read the question. The other team will answer. The challenging team will use the reference in Luke to check the other team’s response. A point will be given to the answering team for a correct answer and two points to the challenging team if it can prove from the passage in Luke that an answer is incorrect (*younger students will need help from teachers for this*). If time allows, continue until all questions are used.

Have a set time limit for discussion among team members. Award points accordingly. Reward team with most points with a prize or treat.

 **Tri-Bond (Game).** Choose teams or use in small group. Have students tell you what the following three things have in common. This is a review for Luke, Chapters 1 through 24, **BLUK22.GF4 Pgs. 1 & 2.**

 **The Ten Lepers (Poem).** Read the poem of the ten lepers aloud to the class without telling them the title of the poem. Ask the students to tell you afterwards about who the story was. Let them suggest an appropriate title for this poem. Some of the students may enjoy telling stories in rhyme or rap. Suggest certain characters from the book of Luke and ask for one-liners that rhyme with each other as you take turns around the group.

Man carrying a jar of water, a house a man enters, guest room — What and where Peter and John were to look for and go to prepare for the Passover.

Nations will rise against nation, Kingdom against Kingdom, great earthquakes and famines – Signs of the end times.

“Women, I don’t know Him,” “Man, I am not!” “Man, I don’t know what you’re talking about!” – Peter’s denials.
