Lesson 4

God Always Wins

(Exodus 5-12)

Note:

Help the children understand the meaning of the word “wins” before story time by starting out with a few simple contests. Use the word “wins” to refer to the person who succeeds. For example, ask the children to drop clothespins in a bottle. When a child drops them all in, make the comment, “(Child’s name) did it! He WINS!”

STORY:

Look at all the people!
They are sad.
They want to go away.
But this man won’t let them go.

Show people (picture 4a).
Make a sad face.

Show Pharaoh (picture 4b).
Shake head “no.”

God knows about the people.
God knows about the man.

Point up. Point to the people (4a).
Point up. Point to the man (4b)

“We want to go away,”
the people said.
“No, no, no,” said the man.

Shake head “no.”

“God, help us! God, help us!”
Said the people.

Show praying people (picture 4c).
Make a praying gesture.

Will God hear them?
Will God help them?

YES!
God will hear them!
God will help them!
He will take them away from the man.
God is strong!
God is big!

Nod head “yes” and smile big.

Make a strong gesture.
Make a big gesture.

STORY CONTINUED:

The bad man said, "No!
You can't go! No! No! No!"
But God said, "Yes! Yes! Yes!"
So the man had to let the people go.
God always wins.

Point to the man (4b). Shake finger. Point up. Nod head and smile. Show the people leaving (picture 4d). Nod head.
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REVIEW:

The people wanted to go away.
What did the man say? [no]
What did God say? [yes]
God took the people away from the man.
God is strong.
God always wins!

There's nothing my God cannot do!

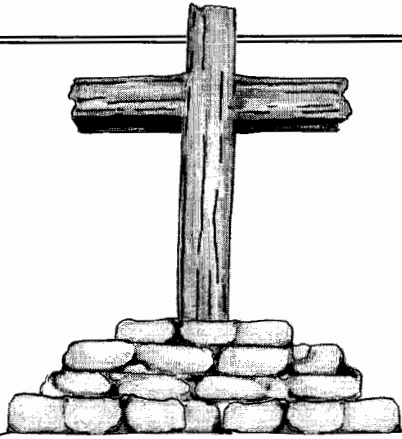

Lesson 4 **God Always Wins**

STORY:

God Frees His People from Pharoah (Exodus 5-12)

THEME:

God Always Wins

AT HOME:

When things are hard for you or your child, make statements like "God, please help us." For example, if you are having a hard time lifting something heavy, say, "God, please help me."

Remind your child that God is strong; God is big.

Help your child understand the meaning of the word "wins." Use it frequently in conversation. Remind your child that the bad man said, "No." God said, "Yes." Make the statement, "God always wins."

PRAY:

Praise God because He always wins.

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
